

HOLY BAPTISM

Family, sponsors, and children gather around the font.

Pastor: God, who is rich in mercy and love... and joined in God's mission for the life of the world.

Sponsor: We present Beau Richard Burdges for baptism.

Pastor: Called by the Holy Spirit, trusting in the grace and love of God, do you desire to have Beau Richard baptized into Christ?

Parents: We do.

As you bring your child to receive the gift of baptism, you are entrusted with responsibilities:

to live with Beau among God's faithful people,
bring Beau to the word of God and the holy supper,
teach Beau the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments,
place in Beau's hands the holy scriptures,
and nurture Beau in faith and prayer,
so that Beau may learn to trust God,
proclaim Christ through word and deed,
care for others and the world God made,
and work for justice and peace.

Do you promise to help Beau grow in the Christian faith and life? Parents: We do.

People of God, do you promise to support Beau, praying for Beau's new life in Christ? Congregation: **We do.**

Pastor: Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God, the powers of this world that rebel against God, and the ways of sin that draw you from God?

All: We renounce them.

Do you believe in God the Father?

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

Blessed are you, holy God...through our Savior Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

Amen.

Beau Richard, you are baptized in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Amen.

We give you thanks, O God, that through water and the Holy Spirit you give your children new birth, cleanse them from sin, and raise them to eternal life. Sustain Beau with the gift of your Holy Spirit: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in your presence, both now and forever.

Beau Richard, child of God, you have been sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever.

The Sunday Forum has been exploring the question "What does it mean to be 'church' today?" using the book Rooted and Renewing: Imaging the Church's Future in Light of Its New Testament Origins [Fortress Press, 2019] by Prof. Troy Troftgruben of Wartburg Theological Seminary. Today, he will join us at 10:30 am via Zoom to answer general questions about the book and to lead us in exploring the unity of the church as presented in the chapter entitled "Being a Body in a Stratified World".
