



## Growing in Giving Kicks-off Today After Worship – Koch Chapel, Patio, & Patio Room

Today following worship, we invite you to join us in the Courtyard for coffee and cake welcoming newcomers to Our Saviour's. Then we hope you will head into the Chapel, Patio, and Patio Room to see what has been done and to to learn what we hope to do with **Growing in Giving**.



Once the hub of Our Saviors Lutheran Church, the Patio Room had

become an overlooked and underutilized space. During our shared Lent services with Lutheran Campus Ministry, and as small groups looked for space to meet, the patio area once again became a hub of activity. New ideas were shared about what could happen in the space. Last year we made a few basic updates but now it's time to create a space that is flexible, functional, and inviting for small groups, meetings, and ministries.

**Growing in Giving** is a special appeal to improve the Patio Room and its surrounding areas. Last year we updated the flooring and trim. Additional funds will provide an expandable conference table, comfortable chairs, lighting, rugs, sound-abating panels, and bathroom access. A keypad will make the space more accessible. Patio furniture, cushions, and lighting will brighten the outside patio area. Commitments of time and talents will help with stucco repair, landscaping, and decluttering. By Growing in Giving, we will expand our outreach within our congregation, our neighborhood, and our community at large. To accomplish this, we invite Growing Gifts – one-time gifts above and beyond weekly giving. We also invite Giving Hours, gifts of time, and talent to complete the project this year. In the coming weeks, you will receive additional information and an invitation to consider your own support.

#### **About Pentecost**

Pentecost means "fiftieth." Fifty days after Easter, we celebrate the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost. The Pentecost mentioned in our reading from Acts 2 refers to Shavuot, the spring harvest festival in Jewish tradition. As Christianity evolved into a distinct faith tradition, Pentecost became a Christian holiday. Easter (Christian) and Passover (Jewish) are both connected to lunar cycles, but they differ in how the lunar cycle determines the holiday, so they are not always aligned. One connection is that Pentecost is 50 days after Easter and Shavuot is 50 days after Passover. On Pentecost, Christians celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit. The Spirit brings the wideness of God's mercy to places we least expect it—to a crowd of strangers of different lands and tongues, to dry bones, to our weak hearts. Jesus promises disciples that they will be accompanied by the Holy Spirit, and that this Spirit reveals the truth. We celebrate that we too have been visited with this same Spirit. Guided by the truth, we join together in worship, and then disperse to share the fullness of Christ's love with the world. (adapted from ELCA Sundays and Seasons).

**Today's readings** provide insights into the nature of Pentecost's celebration of God's Spirit. The Gospel of John provides Jesus' promise to the disciples of an imminent gift of God's Spirit. The psalmist celebrates God's Spirit as the source of all life. Paul speaks of our life in the Spirit and the role of hope. The Book of Acts narrates the gift of God's Spirit on the day of Pentecost.

Today we welcome new friends into a deeper engagement with the life of Our Saviour's. You may notice that some are being received as "voting members," while others are being received as "friends." Membership is a defined category in our Constitution. Voting members are baptized members who have been confirmed in this congregation, baptized as an adult, or who have transferred from another congregation. Confirmation is an affirmation of baptism that persons baptized as infants intentionally choose to affirm their baptismal vows. Voting members are expected to commune with and make a contribution to the congregation at least once a year. Voting members have the privilege of voice and vote at congregational meetings and serving on our Congregational Council and call committees. Associate and seasonal members are those who retain membership at another congregation. The Constitution outlines some specific details regarding associate and seasonal members. Friends is a newer category created out of pastoral care and the changing nature of church community. Friends are those who desire an intentional relationship with Our Saviour's, but for a range of reasons, do not wish to join as a member. We welcome all newcomers, members and friends, to participate in the life of the congregation as worship and community leaders (except where limited by our Constitution). We typically receive newcomers in worship twice a year (on Pentecost and Reformation Sunday).
