

OPEN DEPARTMENT

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. ENTRY DEADLINE IS THE LAST SUNDAY OF JULY.
2. Only Official Northern District Fair Entry Forms will be accepted.
3. Entries may be mailed to: Northern District Fair - PO Box 131 - Cadillac - Michigan 49601; or they may be dropped off at the Fair Office on the last Saturday and Sunday of July, from 2:00 to 5:00pm. Online entries can be made at: NorthernDistrictFair.FairEntry.com.
4. All entries must be paid in full at the time of entry or they will not be accepted.
5. All Exhibitors will be given ONE Exhibitor's Pass, which will allow free access to the fairgrounds each day. The pass will not allow entry to the Grandstand events or the Carnival. Lost or stolen passes will NOT be replaced.
6. No more than three entries will be accepted from any one Exhibitor in any one class, unless noted in the fairbook. All animal exhibits are limited to one entry per section/class.
7. Competition is open to all residents of the State of Michigan. No out-of-state entries permitted, unless approved by the Fairboard prior to entry deadline.
8. During the Fair, the Superintendents of each department will have the ultimate authority to disqualify or remove any exhibit that they deem unworthy, or for any rule violation. Superintendent's decisions are final.
9. Exhibitors who wish to protest or appeal a placement must do so in writing within 10 days from the close of Fair.
10. Exhibitors must have their Civic Center exhibits in place no later than 7:00 pm Sunday. The Civic Center will be open Saturday afternoon, and Sunday afternoon for entries. Times to be posted in the Events section of the Fairbook.
11. All exhibits, both Civic Center and Animal, shall remain in place at the Fairgrounds until the last Sunday of Fair, unless approved by the Superintendent. Early removal of any exhibit shall mean all monies earned will be forfeited by the Exhibitor. EXCEPTION: Market Animals may be released early for processing.
12. All animal exhibitors MUST be present to show their own animals.
13. The Northern District Fair Association will not be responsible for any loss, damage, or injury to any animals exhibited, or for damage or destruction to any article of any kind that is entered in the Fair. Each exhibitor will be responsible for any injury that may be occasioned to any person by any animal owned or exhibited by that person, and they shall indemnify the Northern District Fair Association against all claims or injury occasioned by any animal owned or exhibited by him, or arising from any negligence of the person in charge of that exhibit.
14. ALL open and youth exhibitors, parents and/or chaperones of youth exhibitors are expected to be properly attired while on the Fairgrounds. Shirts, pants or shorts, and shoes shall be worn at all times. Absolutely no bare feet, swimwear, or other inappropriate clothing will be tolerated. Violators may be asked to leave the grounds.
15. The Civic Center will be closed all day Monday while judging takes place.
16. All animal exhibitors must adhere to the Michigan Department of Agriculture and Rural Development (MDARD) health regulations. Visit www.Michigan.gov/MDARD for more information.
17. Premium Checks must be cashed within 30 days of the end of Fair.
18. NO PERSON UNDER EIGHTEEN (18) YEARS OF AGE WILL BE ALLOWED ON THE GROUNDS AFTER ALL DEPARTMENTS AND THE MIDWAY ARE CLOSED FOR THE NIGHT, EXCEPT THOSE IN THE COMPANY OF THEIR PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN.
19. The sale, use, or possession of alcoholic beverages, tobacco products, or drugs is forbidden by Law on Wexford County property.
20. Absolutely no weapons, either real or toy, will be brought onto or sold on the grounds of the Northern District Fair. Violators will be immediately removed and will be subject to action by the local law enforcement. A weapon shall include, but is not limited to: guns, knives, blow guns, slingshots, pellet guns, paintball guns.
21. See each individual Division for rules specific to that area.

Exhibitor Code of Conduct:

The Northern District Fair expects orderly and courteous conduct by exhibitors and attendants. All exhibitors and their parties are to maintain decorum and respect for all other exhibitors, judges, fair representatives, families and volunteers. Harrassment, profanity, unsportsmanlike conduct, disrespect, or inappropriate behavior of any party, either directly, through digital communication, or on social media is inexcusable. Inappropriate behavior may result in early release of exhibits, and ejection from the grounds of all involved individuals. Rulings of the Northern District Fair board are final.

DEPARTMENT 11 -- OPEN CHICKENS

SPECIFIC RULES

1. The entry fee is \$1 per bird, and is due with your entry.
2. All exhibitors are required to feed, water and clean under their cages at least twice per day. Failure to take care of your animals and exhibit area in a satisfactory manner may result in loss of premiums due, if any. On show days, cages must be cleaned prior to the start of showing. On Auction day, cages must be cleaned before 5:00pm.
3. ALL poultry entered MUST be Pullorum tested ON ENTRY DAY prior to entry into the barn. Testing is provided by the Northern District Fair, and is available from 8:00 am until 1:00pm on entry day. No bird will be allowed in the barn before they are tested! Only those birds entered will be tested at no charge. Exhibitors wishing to have extra birds tested will be required to pay \$2 per bird. Pigeons, waterfowl, and doves are exempt from testing.
4. Birds showing symptoms of disease or illness will not be permitted to remain on the grounds. This includes, but is not limited to: fowl mites, severe leg mites, respiratory/nasal discharge, swollen eyes
5. Exhibitors may advertise their birds for sale only AFTER the judging has been completed.
6. Judging will be in accordance with the current edition of the Standard of Perfection. The judge's decisions are final.
7. Exhibitors may only enter one bird per class.
8. Birds shown in Open may not also be shown in Youth.
9. All waterfowl MUST be legbanded by the Exhibitor prior to entry. This is for identification purposes only.
10. Exhibitors provide their own feed and water dishes, as well as their own feed. Sawdust for under cages is provided by the Northern District Fair. Please make sure that the water dishes are attached firmly to the cages so they are not dumped.
11. For the safety of your animals, the Small Animal Barn will be locked overnight. Barn hours will be posted on entry day.
12. Per MDARD Regulations, absolutely no transport cages, boxes or cartons shall be left inside barns during Fair.

SPECIFIC RULES:

1. Only Official Northern District Fair Entry Forms will be accepted.
2. Entries are due no later than the last Sunday in July.
3. The entry fee is \$1 per rabbit/cavy, and is due with your entry.
4. Judging shall be governed by the current ARBA Standard of Perfection. Any rabbit/Cavy that does not conform in any way to the Standard for its breed should be shown as a mixed breed.
5. All rabbits must have a permanent tattoo in their left ear on entry day. No exceptions to this rule.
It is the exhibitor's responsibility to get their rabbits tattooed PRIOR to entry day.
6. Exhibitor to provide their own cages for cavies.
7. NO pregnant does, does with litters, and no babies less than 4 weeks old will be allowed in the barn.

DEPARTMENT 15 -- OPEN CLASS HORSES

*NOTE: Thursday's Open Horse Show will be a haul-in show. You will be able to haul in for that day's show, and then leave when you are done. You must be stalled all week to show in the Tuesday Youth Show.

Pre-registration is encouraged, but not required. The pre-registration fee is \$15, and the day-of fee is \$20.

This fee will cover all classes. You may request a stall when hauling in, for a fee of \$20 (refunded when stall is cleaned prior to leaving). Please be aware that haul-in stalls are pending availability only.

**Entry will be through the side gate behind Horizon Bank on the North side of the fairgrounds.

PROOF OF COGGINS TEST MANDATORY BEFORE UNLOADING!

SPECIFIC RULES:

- 1 Please refer to General Rules in the front of the Fairbook.
- 2 Copy of CURRENT coggins must be sent with entry.
- 3 Stalls must be cleaned daily. Periodic checks will be done for stall cleanliness and animal condition.
- 4 Horses must have water at all times and be fed no later than 9:00p.m.
- 5 No horse shall be brought in to replace another horse for any reason.
- 6 Horses are required to be back in their stalls at 9:00 p.m., unless requested by a vet to do otherwise.
- 7 Halters must be worn at all times.
- 10 **No horses may be ridden between barns and the ring, nor shall any horse be out on the South end if the barns.**
- 11 TWO persons from a group MUST be in the barn at all times from 1:00 pm to 10:00 pm, except on Tuesday and Thursday, when time begins at 5:00pm.
- 12 Shoes or boots are required to be worn at all times while in the barn areas. NO EXCEPTIONS!
- 13 CLUB LEADERS: Sign-in sheet is required to be turned in to the Horse Superintendent. Each horse barn participant is to lean walkways, help people, answer questions, and direct questions or concerns to Horse Superintendent.
- 14 Pre-entry fee is \$15 per horse, to be paid at time of pre-entry.
- 15 Horse age is computed from January 1 of the current year.
- 16 No premium will be awarded when the animal is not worthy, even with no competition present.
- 17 Exhibitors may show 2 (two) horses, pending stall availability.
- 18 Novice classes will be open to exhibitors of all ages, who are first-year show persons in each section.
NOTE: Riding classes are walk/trot. Example: If a person is in 2nd year showmanship but is a first-year rider, he/she may be a novice in riding classes only. An exhibitor cannot show more than 2 years in the Novice classes.
- 19 Rider's age is determined by the age he/she is on January 1 of the current year.
- 20 Coggins Test copy required to be included with entry form. Must not be older than 12 months on first day of Fair.
- 21 Stallions may show in Open Class horses ONLY, and must be shown by an adult exhibitor. Stallions are only allowed to enter pending stall availability. They will be housed in their own area.
Make sure to check with Horse Superintendent BEFORE you enter your stallions!

DEPARTMENT 35: QUILT SHOW

SPECIFIC RULES:

1. Quilts are to be made by the **Amateur or Home Quilter** who has entered it.
2. Quilts can only be entered one year at the Fair.
3. Quilts must be clean, finished, and in good condition.
4. Entry fee for the Quilt Show is \$5 per quilt. An Exhibitor can enter up to three (3) quilts per Section.
5. All quilts are entered by WIDTH of the quilt. Non-directional quilts shall be entered by their shortest side as the width. Quilts will be measured on entry day.
6. No names are to be displayed on the front of the quilt. If you have a signature tag anywhere on your quilt, it must be covered up when entered. Fair personnel will have cover material, if needed.
7. Official Northern District Fair entry forms must be used, and all information must be complete. Online entries can be made: NorthernDistrictFair.FairEntry.com
8. Entry deadline is the last Sunday in July.
9. Judging will be completed on Monday of Fair, in the Civic Center. Please note that the Civic Center will remain closed to the public until Tuesday. People's Choice Awards will be tallied on Thursday evening, and ribbons placed on Friday morning.
10. Quilts are to be brought to the Civic Center on the Saturday before Fair from 3:00pm until 6:00pm, OR Sunday before Fair from 3:00 pm until 7:00 pm.
11. Quilts are to remain on display in the Civic Center all week during the Fair. Quilts can then be picked up on the Sunday AFTER Fair, from 9:00 am until 1:00 pm. NOTE: If you cannot pick up your quilts during these hours, you must make arrangements with the Quilt Show Superintendent PRIOR to Sunday. Quilts must be signed out by their owner, or approved individual.
12. Each exhibitor will be given ONE Exhibitor Pass on entry day. Do not lose it, or you will have to pay to enter the grounds each day. NOTE: these passes are for entry into the grounds only, and will not get you into the carnival or the grandstand.
13. **Special Awards will not necessarily be in cash, based on sponsor preference, but will have AT LEAST the value stated on the premium.**
