ORDINANCE NO. 2020-07-14-01

(Revision of 2010-01-26-02)

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KEMPNER, TEXAS, ESTABLISHING MINIMUM MUNICIPAL COURT FINES FOR PERSONS WHO ELECT TO PAY SUCH FINES BY MAIL, IN PERSON AT THE COURT CLERK'S OFFICE, OR AT A TIME OTHER THAN A SCHEDULED COURT DATE WITH THE JUDGE; AND PROVIDING SEVERABILITY, OPEN MEETINGS, PENALTY AND EFFECTIVE DATE CLAUSES.

Whereas, the City of Kempner, Texas (the "City") is authorized to adopt ordinances that are for the good government, peace, and order of the municipality and that are necessary and proper; and

Whereas, the City has established the Kempner Municipal Court, which has the power to set and impose fines not in excess of those amounts set by state law; and

Whereas, some Municipal Court defendants elect to plead "guilty" or "nolo contendere" and pay municipal court fines by mail, in person at the court clerk's office, or at times other than the defendant's scheduled court date when the judge is not present; and

Whereas, it is necessary and proper for the efficient operation of the municipal court for the City to establish minimum fines for those persons who elect to plead "guilty" or "nolo contendere" and pay a municipal court fine without meeting with the judge; and

Whereas, the City does not intend to limit the discretion of the municipal court judge to set fines for those defendant who appear in front of the judge for sentencing;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KEMPNER, TEXAS THAT;

Section 1. Findings: The foregoing recitals are hereby found to be true and correct and are incorporated into this ordinance as findings of fact by the City Council of Kempner, Texas

Section 2. Applicability: The minimum fines established herein (hereinafter referred to as "Window Fine") apply to persons who elect to enter a plea of "guilty" or "nolo contendere" and pay the fine for an offense over which the Kempner Municipal Court has jurisdiction by mail, in person at the court clerk's office, or at a time other than the person's scheduled court date and without meeting with the judge. This ordinance is not meant to limit the discretion of the municipal court judge to set fines for persons who appear before the judge for sentencing.

Section 3. Minimum Window Fine Established:

- (a) The schedule of minimum fines set forth in Exhibit "A" is hereby adopted and set as minimum Window Fines for the Kempner Municipal Court.
- (b) All other violations not specifically identified and set in Exhibit "A" are hereby set according to the following schedule:

Violations with a Fine Range of:

The Minimum Window Fine shall be:

\$1,00 - \$200,00	\$100.00
\$1.00 - \$500.00	\$325,00
\$1.00 - \$2,000.00	\$770.00

(c) The minimum Window Fines established by this ordinance do not include court costs.

<u>Section 4. Severability:</u> If any provision of this ordinance or the application of any provision to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications thereof which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end, the provisions of this ordinance are declared to be severable.

Section 5. Effective Date: This ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage and publication in the manner set forth within the provisions of the Local Gov't Code.

Section 6. Open Meetings: That it is hereby officially found and determined that the meeting at which this ordinance was passed was open to the public as required and that public notice of the time, place, and purpose of said meeting was given as required by the *Open Meetings Act, Chapt. 551, Loc. Gov't Code*.

ORDINANCE NO. 2020-07-14-02

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KEMPNER, TEXAS, ESTABLISHING A CHARGE AND REQUIRING PRIOR PAYMENT BEFORE THE CITY RESPONDS TO CERTAIN REQUESTS FOR THE PRODUCTION OF PUBLIC INFORMATION OR FOR COPIES OF PUBLIC INFORMATION IN ACCORDANCE WITH AND PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 552.275 OF THE TEXAS GOVERNMENT CODE; ESTABLISHING REASONABLE MONTHLY AND ANNUAL TIME LIMITS ON THE TIME SPENT BY CITY PERSONNEL ON RESPONDING TO A REQUESTOR OF PUBLIC INFORMATION; ESTABLISHING COSTS TO BE PAID BY THE PUBLIC FOR REQUESTS THAT EXCEED THE REASONABLE TIME LIMIT; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE, OPEN MEETINGS AND RELATED MATTERS.

WHEREAS, Section 552.275 of the Texas Government Code authorizes the City Council to establish reasonable limits on the financial burden placed upon it in responding to requests for public information;

WHEREAS, the City spends considerable resources in responding to requests for public information;

WHEREAS, the City Council supports and upholds the ideals of the Texas Public Information Act (the "Act"), namely that each person is entitled, unless otherwise expressly provided by law, at all times to complete information about the affairs of the City and the official acts of its public officials and employees;

WHEREAS, the Act establishes no limit on the number of requests a particular requestor may make during any prescribed period of time;

WHEREAS, many types of requests require a substantial amount of employee or personnel time with which to comply;

WHEREAS, the Act provides that a governmental body may establish a reasonable limit on the amount of time that personnel of the governmental body are required to spend producing public information for inspection or duplication by a requestor, or providing copies of public information to a requestor, without recovering fully its costs attributable to that personnel time;

WHEREAS, the City Council deems it advisable to establish a reasonable number of hours per fiscal year that personnel of the City will be required to spend producing public information for inspection or duplication by a requestor, or providing copies of public information to a requestor, without recovering its costs attributable to that personnel time; and

WHEREAS, once such reasonable amount of time is exceeded, the City Council believes that personnel costs should be recoverable to the extent authorized by Texas Government Code Section 552.275.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KEMPNER, TEXAS:

Section 1. <u>Findings</u>. The foregoing recitals are hereby found to be true and correct and are hereby adopted by the City Council and made a part hereof for all purposes as findings of fact.

Section 2. <u>Time Limits Established</u>. Pursuant to Texas Government Code section 552.275, thirty-six (36) hours, per fiscal year, per requestor, and fifteen (15) hours, per month, per requestor, are reasonable limits set on the amount of time City personnel are required to spend producing public information for inspection or duplication by a requestor or providing copies of public information to a requestor. Each time the City complies with a request for public information, the City shall:

- Provide the requestor with a written statement of the amount of personnel time spent complying with that request and the cumulative amount of time spent complying with requests for public information from that requester during the applicable monthly or yearly period. The amount of time spent preparing the written statement described herein may not be included in the amount of time included in the statement provided to the requestor under this subsection.
- At such time that, in connection with a request for public information, the cumulative amount of personnel time spent complying with requests for public information from the same requester equals or exceeds the limit established herein, the City shall provide the requester with a written estimate of the total cost, including materials, personnel time, and overhead expenses, necessary to comply with the request. The written estimate must be provided to the requester on or before the 10th day after the date on which the public information was requested. The amount of this charge relating to the cost of locating, compiling, and producing the public information shall be as established by rules prescribed by the Texas Attorney General under Sections 552.262(a) and (b).
- If it is determined that additional time is required to prepare the written estimate under Subsection (e) of Texas Government Code§ 552,275, the City shall provide the requester with a written statement of that determination and the City shall provide the written statement under that subsection as soon as practicable, but on or before the 10th day after the date the City provided the statement under this subsection.
- If the City provides a requester with the written statement under Subsection (e) of Texas Government Code §552.275 and the time limits prescribed by Subsection (a) of Texas Government Code §552.275 regarding the requestor have been exceeded, the City is not required to produce public information for inspection or duplication or to provide copies of public information in response to the requester's request unless on or before the 10th day after the date the City provided the written statement under that subsection, the requester pays the lesser of, or submits a statement in writing to the City in which the requester commits to pay the lesser of:

- a. the actual costs incurred in complying with the requester's request, including the cost of materials and personnel time and overhead; or
- b. the amount stated in the written statement provided under Subsection (e) of Texas Government Code §552,275.
- 5) If the requester fails or refuses to pay or submit the written statement under Subsection (g) of Texas Government Code §552.275, the requester is considered to have withdrawn the requestor's pending request for public information.
- Pursuant to §552.275 of the Texas Government Code, the limitations adopted herein by the City pursuant to Texas Government Code §552.275 do not apply if the requestor is a representative of:
 - a. a radio or television station that holds a license issued by the Federal Communications Commission;
 - b. a newspaper that is qualified under Section 2051.044 to publish legal notices or is a free newspaper of general circulation and that is published at least once a week and available and of interest to the general public in connection with the dissemination of news;
 - c. a newspaper of general circulation that is published on the Internet by a news medium engaged in the business of disseminating new or information to the general public; or
 - d. a magazine that is published at least once a week or on the Internet by a news medium engaged in the business of disseminating news or information to the general public.
 - e. if the requestor is an elected official of the United States, this state, or a political subdivision of this state;
 - f. if the requestor is a representative of a publicly funded legal services organization that is exempt from federal income taxation under Section 501(a), Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, by being listed as an exempt entity under Section 501(c)(3) of that code.
- **Section 3.** <u>Severability</u>. Should any sentence, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase or section of this Ordinance be adjudged or held to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of this Ordinance as a whole, or any part or provision thereof other than the part so decided to be invalid, illegal or unconstitutional.
- Section 4. <u>Effective Date</u>. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage and the publication of the caption, as the law and charter in such cases provide.
- Section 5. Open Meetings. That it is hereby officially found and determined that the meeting at which this Ordinance is passed was open to the public as required and that public notice of the time, place, and purpose of said meeting was given as required by the Open Meeting Act, Chapter 551, Tx. Gov't. Code.



Mayor and Council, I bring this to you not as a question but as a statement and food for thought. Ask yourself " Why is the City Park being vandalized so much, and always seems to be geared towards racism? This never occurred before and seems strange that even with video cameras in the park, with eyes everywhere, this is still happening? Could this all be a set up? Also why do citizens always have to bring the park issues to the mayor? Don't we have a park supervisor? Shouldn't they be seeing this almost right after it happens and not weeks later? Seems to me that they aren't doing their job if they don't see this stuff and report it to the city. And since it seems like that's the case, I think we should re-evaluate their employment and find someone more competent. Dear council, I would be there in person to deliver these comments, but we are still restricted from attendance. I have a couple of quick things to point to, and thank you for your time. The first item is that there is currently a significant disconnect between the guidance and enforcement of COVID precautions we are all getting now. We are not allowed to attend the meetings in person over concerns of COVID, and there is a county requirement to wear masks in many public buildings, including, if I am correct, city hall. Social distancing might mitigate that in some instances, but I have, on two occasions, been to city hall on business and not been required to put a mask on as well as staff working there have not been masked or socially distanced. I bring this to your attention to highlight the hypocrisy. Right now, citizens can't attend the

meeting over COVID risks, yet many of the people in the room with you right now are not practicing safety precautions in their daily work, thus increasing your chance of exposure. There is a solution to this, and the City of Bartlett has already proven it to be effective. An utterly virtual city council meeting conducted on Zoom, where the public can participate and all are safe from unnecessary risks. I have mentioned this several times, but no one seems to want to action this real, safe solution. The second item is the park, which I assume many will be commenting on it tonight. The memorial has caused the park to be closed for far too long, and the newest bit of construction has ripped out a good portion of the landscaping this council paid \$5,000 for less than a year ago. The mayor cites a safety concern as the reason for the memorial work, but where is the report showing the wall was indeed a safety issue? Why a complete redesign and not just a repair to fix the unsafe problem? Based on the redesign, much of the landscaping that is being torn out is to make the memorial ADA compliant again, but was the work necessary? How much has been spent so far? How much is going to be spent to complete this project? The council should have approved a project of this size like the Kempner Sign replacement was, but I can't find where the council approved. The last thing would be the special called meeting last week and the posting of the agenda for tonight. The state quorum requirements for a regular meeting are 3 of 5 council members for a regular meeting, but 2/3 are needed for special meetings. This means that 4 of 5 were required to make last week's meeting meet quorum. It did not meet that requirement. However, I have noticed that some of the items from that meeting have been put back on the agenda for this meeting, which is good. However, I must ask each of you if a quorum is not met at a special meeting and items are passed, are they legal? Look back over the last year, and you will find another meeting that didn't meet the 2/3 requirement. On top of the quorum issue, the mayor posted the restrictions and comments guidance almost 45 minutes after the close of city hall, so I ask how exactly were citizens supposed to present comments? Lastly, based on the historical advice from the city attorney, agenda posting, to be compliant with TOMA's 72hour requirement, must be online as posting at city hall is not enough. This agenda was not online until yesterday, so the question that must be asked is if tonight's meeting is valid or in violation of TOMA

5. Reports

• City (Mayor)- Nothing outside the multiple infractions the fourth of July weekend about the firework displays. I know many are aware of it we have received several calls. It would be a mass effort to chase every infraction concerning fireworks. People that have lived here for years know we have an ordinance as do the surrounding cities. Someone even shot fireworks off in the park, Many violations of fireworks occured. I know we have two firework stands in our ETJ that are constantly open during these times of year and the moment that someone purchases them and goes left or right depending on which stand purchasing from if they are in your car you are transporting with intent to ignite fireworks and if our officer is two blocks down the road and they get pulled over they can be cited.

Who owns these fireworks stands? Who allows these fireworks to be displayed? Who votes on these ordinances? Therefore it's something we need to look at. So it is just something to think about especially since citizens are constantly calling we can't chase them all over the city, So citizens please understand it would be a lot of work just for this small city to go to every firework infraction.

- Police Report for June (Chief Rodriguez)
- Mr. Ruszkiewicz asked Chief Rodriguez if the service calls are just in the city limits or do you go outside the city as well?
- Chief Rodriguez stated the calls for service may be inside the city or in the county if we are asked by the county to assist them. We do help the Sheriff's office from time to time if they do not have a deputy close or need assistance.
- Mr. Ruszkiewicz stated that he had someone call him about a family issue and wanted to file a report here in Kempner but they do not live inside the city limits.
 So would they go to the county?
- Chief Rodriguez stated if they wanted to file a formal report or complaint then yes
 they would have to go to the Sheriff's office. What we do with these calls of
 service if it is an emergency and there not close we go cool the situation down and
 when they get there they have the scene.
- Mr. Ruszkiewicz asked if there was a police report on the graffiti on the bathroom and the columns how did they go about doing that.
- Mayor stated we had a citizen come to the City and made the city aware and the fact that they were offended and the city assured him that we would take care of it. I don't want children or anyone to come to the park and be offended with vulgar markings. We don't want children to see that. Even when the swastika was grinded down it still wasn't enough, ue to it's deep carving in the city park restroom. It shouldn't happen and why its happening only God knows.
- Mr. Ruzkiewicz asks Mr. David Lowe if there was any coverage of the graffiti in the bathroom and on the columns under the bridge.
- Mr. Lowe stated with they did here about the swastika in the bathroom and he just got news of the bridge today.
- Mr. Ruszkiewicz just wanted to point out that it is a repeated incident,
- Mr. Gipson says it is unfortunate that we have graffiti and racist comments in our city. My only concern is on the columns for the U.S highway bridge my first thought is that property belongs to the state and I hear you say that it was grinded down that makes me think that it destroys the integrity of the bridge and I'm curious if anyone reported that to the state highway dept.
- Mayor answers that the grinding down was in the bathroom of the swastika not on the bridge. Nothing was grinded down on the bridge.

- Mr. Gipson stated thank you for clarifying that. The graffiti on the bridge that was
 posted on the site was that reported to the state since it is there property?
- Mayor stated with the first thing is that we do have the entrance to that side of the bridge coming down the hill from our park and many people go down that hill. So as far as the state no we have not but what we can do as a city is gate it all the way off so that no one can go down with there children to wet there feet if that is something you want to do let's get it done but if not and we allow people to go down that hill and get in the water then there is some type of ownership we need to have unless we close it off. If we close it off anyone that goes over that gate is in violation and the city is not held accountable but if it is open then we do have some responsibility
- Mrs. Vandeveer asks where this is located?
- Mayor answers with if you go into the park and walk around the track then you can go down to the creek from that side of the park. If we don't want that kind of responsibility then we need to close it.
- Mrs. Vandeveer says well they weren't supposed to that first.
- Mayor answers with well there were a lot of things not working right now and I
 understand that but right now we are having issues but right now what are some
 solutions to rectify these issues?
- Mr. Wilkerson says while we are on this subject hashing out to put a gate there
 can we get ahold of Txt Dot for someone to go down there with some simply
 green and scrub that off.
- Mayor stated with I have been having a lot of phone conversations with them
 already for several issues and I understand the simply green deal but that would
 be a lot of elbow grease since every pillar is marked and above the pillars as well.
 We have to relinquish responsibility or accept the responsibility those are our two
 options.
- Mrs. Parker I know the cameras have shown a lot and have been a good edition and I know they can't cover the whole park in our budget and probably did not see over there but they have been catching a lot of events happening there so I think they are important to have. Is that property down there park property is apart of the park or is it a private area?
- Mayor stated with I can tell you this that has been a question since I have come
 into the office. There is a portion unaccounted for and until I see stakes of the
 boundary that's what I need to see. Where does it start and where does it end?
 That has my concern so we can know what the city is actually responsible for.
 Because if we have to close it off then my heart goes out to the families that love
 the water. So those are the things that I'm looking for and into.
- Mr. Gipson stated I think it would be very unfortunate for the city to close off that
 area of the park because of malicious graffiti even though it is state property, not

city property I also enjoy going down to Taylor creek myself it is beautiful its a neat place to go and I don't think we need to deprive our citizens of that.

 - Mr. Wilkerson asks Judge Mahoney on the fines is that just updating it of what it was or is it new? Can I get a better explanation?
 - Judge Mahoney answers with it hasn't been updated since 2010 so what I did was
 update it with what Lampasas County had.
 - Mr. Ruszkiewiz comments on the legal services to the council that we are in a period of time where the expenses are quite high I guess we just need to be conservative with our time with them.
 - Motion to approve 6B and 6C, 4 (Parker, Wilkerson, Ruskiewicz, Vandeveer) in favor 1 (Gipson) opposed, motion carries.
- d. Consider adoption of Ordinance 2020-07-14-02 establishing monthly and annual time limits on the time spent by City personnel on responding to a requestor seeking public information.
 - Mr. Gipson stated I have had a couple of citizens ask me questions about the
 request of information part of it was in the dear remarks at the beginning of the
 meeting talking about requests to the city where you the Mayor sent them to the

- attorney and the attorneys sent the to the AG and that they were denied the information can you speak to that concern?
- Mayor answers Yes, I can. Since I have been in this seat there has been an influx of open records requests the city has an obligation to respond to open records requests. When they request something like bank statements And some of the comments are "it shouldn't go to the attorneys it should just be given to us". No, it shouldn't we can't just hand over credit card statement or something as such with nothing redacted so it goes to the attorney. The attorney sends it off for legal opinion and they tell us if they are required to have it or not and if they are then it gets sent immediately. This is not about withholding information this is about a plethora of open records requests by the same individuals over and over again that is why this ordinance is here. At first an open records request sent by email was of no cost but now since there is an abuse of them and the time it takes to gather the information and taking them away from their daily job to go through the archives make copies and send the archives it takes a lot of their time away from city business. Anywhere else you will pay for a copy its that simple if you want it to pay for it if it takes time then pay for if you don't want It don't pay for it. Everything is done by protocols and procedures. The city cannot withhold anything a citizen is supposed to have. I don't handle the open records the City Secretary does. It is not the mayor it's the process.
- Mrs. Parker comments I have read a lot, talked a lot, read a lot about this and to respond back to some of our listeners no I am not stupid I am very educated on what I'm doing I read everything I have printed a copy of the government code I have picked through it with fine-tooth comb and if you go to section 4th whereas it established no limit on no request in a period of time. The whole situation here is to try to give our secretary the rights on their job the same right we have as citizens to ask for open records and the same right to do their job while they work on your open records and the threats to file huge multitude amounts to try and flood the office is selfish and childish and not fair to this city and these secretaries that work hard and that don't get paid enough to put all their hard work in and we are grateful to have them. This is Texas law this isn't a surprise this isn't something the Mayor put up because he is a "communist" which is a comment I got I'm tired of hearing that in our city. Our city has nothing like that on their mind and it is just ridiculous to hear that it is time for this city to pull together and stop wasting time and stop wasting finances we have a job to do and I don't want to see our cities time and money on it. There is nothing illegal about it nothing wrong with it if there is any single issue that is determined to be a problem then tat issue van be pulled out I don't see it as a power grab and the number of things that comes in some is foolish and some are very important that needed to be requested and this is not stopping our right at all but it does slow down our

- number a little bit of wasted time and I think that is important. I have studied it and looked at it and I think it's important.

The reason you are council members is because of your deep love for the city. I often get questions like why do you do it? And why do you put up with so much? I am built for this. It's that simple I didn't do it for me this is all a part of God's plan he knows what is going to happen before we do so I ask you to do your jobs.
- Mr. Wilkerson stated no question just discussion so first addressing Mrs. Parker's concerns and going on record that I don't think your stupid and I don't stand by anyone that does think you are and the decisions that you make are the decisions that are important to you. Shame on them and this is a time where we will agree to disagree I don't think we should charge the citizens for information that is there's any way.
- Mayor asks if there is a motion?
- Mrs. Parker moves to adopt 6D, Mr. Ruskiewicz seconds the motion.
- Mr. Gipson wants a discussion.
- Mayor stated with I asked if everyone wanted anymore discussion and now you want to discuss? Did you hear me? Do I need to speak up?
- Mr. Gipson answers with yes I heard you loud and clear I am seeking the right to speak.
- Mayor says I just want to reiterate that when I ask if anyone else has a discussion that is the time to discuss. When they made their motion then you want to speak. Im just trying to get some clarity, when the floor is open for all discussion that is when you discuss not to wait until after the motion but go ahead.
- Mr. Gipson answers with I will remind you to look at Roberts rules of order at
 any time if the motion is out before the floor the next step is the second then its
 open for discussion we discussed before the motion was made in that discussion
 period is time for anything to be discussed and amendments to the motion on the
 floor.
- Mayor says Robert's rules are a guide. You wanted to discuss before the motion there is no issue for you wanting to discuss when the floor is open for discussion that is when you discuss so please continue your discussion.
- Mr. Gipson I would like to inquire as to how I could amend a motion if there is to be no discussion after the motion is made.
- Mayor answers with if you made the motion then you can amend your motion but you didn't make the motion.

- Mr. Gipson says I move to make a motion to adopt the ordinance and to remove
 4a from section two where is talks about cost to the citizens so that there is no
 cost to the citizens for information.
- Mayor says understand it is costing the city. Don't come in here and ask why does it cost so much if you don't want to charge the citizens. Every council member has a concern to the fees so if you don't want to charge them then don't get upset when we pay the attorneys. Is there anyone that would like to second Mr. Gipson's motion the removal of 4a from the ordinance?
- No second, motion dies.
- We move to the first motion. 2 (Parker, Ruszkiewicz) in favor, 3 (Gipson, Wilkerson, Vandeveer) oppose, motion denied.
- Mr. Gipson states just for the record that the Mayor has informed us that we cannot make amendments to the motion on the floor.
- Mayor states just for the record the mayor did not say that the mayor told Mr.
 Gipson that he cannot amend someone else's motion. We will move forward.
- 7. Consider approval of the City Financial Professional, Mrs. Alice Deocoriza as the City of Kempner Financial Professional.
 - Mr. Gipson says the information that was provided to me about Mrs. Deocoriza that she has no experience working for a city and I don't think she should be our financial representative.
 - Mr. Wilkerson says I have a question. So I was reading through hat conspired from the last meeting and they have mentioned about QuickBooks and that it would be better for the city and would make the transition period a lot easier for us and I'm sold with that idea but she isn't very familiar with the QuickBooks program is that correct?
 - Mayor answers with she is not as well versed as many that have been working with it for ten plus years but even our city secretary has caught on to it pretty quick it is not a hard system to learn it has self-explaining tutorials on it. To say that a person cannot do the financials because she has not worked for a city is a fallacy. The financials that you have in your hand were actually done by Mrs. Deocoriza. She has found some discrepancies. This city has a responsibility and you can sit here and not vote and do whatever. But I also have a job to do and I will do my job to the best of my ability. We will not fall behind and be subject to anyone's games. So you can look at them and actually look at them compare them and they will be bounced off to make sure they are correct. Postpone, deny, do whatever but I will not let the city fall. It's a month to month deal to keep us in line since some people tried to make us fall. The city will continue to go forward.
 - Mrs. Parker, I looked through very carefully she is very educated and she has done a lot of mobile bank work and I have had an extensive conversation with Mrs. Taubert and she would love to help her with the QuickBooks program and she has spoken with her circle of colleagues the thing is our city Is just too small to come in they don't have time to deal

- with this when they are working on big things. We are working with a 30-day evaluation each time that is a perfect way to go. I just wanted to say she is perfectly capable of doing this job. She will just have to catch up with QuickBooks.
- Mayor stated what were looking at is a system, someone else's system so when someone else comes in and we don't know their system, one would need to see and actually research the system to understand how I need to present it, unfortunately, the city was not afforded the opportunity. We have called no pickup. All we can do is pick up from here, Its not hard our budget is not vast its real easy. Everything is online nothing is hidden. Auditors, CPA's can go online and look at everything. You have financials in front of you that was done by Mrs. Alice but the decision is yours.
- Mr. Wilkerson stated so what I'm hearing the concern is doesn't have city experience and I agree with the mayor that her qualities are good my concern at this point is that it is just 30 days and I don't want to sit back here in 30 days so with that being said I move to approve item 7 until we have approved the budget.
- Mr. Ruszkiewicz seconds that motion.
- Mayor asks if anyone would like to discuss.
- Mr. Ruszkiewicz says he would like to add the city has the desktop pro of QuickBooks already and that's what she would be learning and it will be easy for her to learn it.
- Mr. Wilkerson stated I just want to clarify that the motion was until the budget is passed and if at any time if she cant perform then we will meet back and reconsider.
- Mayor stated two things need to be done one is the amendment and two is the budget and I'm not sure anyone understands we sent two checks for insurance one was put in prior to the audit so that is why you had received three September financials. There is also another check for around 19000 that is not done and that is where the amendment comes in and this is very important and then we will talk about the budget keep this in your mind things have to get done we have to get city business done.
- Mayor repeats Mr. Wilkerson's motion to approve item seven Mrs. Alice Deocoriza as
 the new city financial advisor until the budget is completed unless she is not performing
 to the city's standards then we will reconsider this approval.
- All in favor, motion carries.

8. Staff Comments

- Mr. Wilkerson stated I would like to comment about what I have been seeing or hearing a lot of and I just want to address the lack of quorum there's a lot of unknowns and I will be the first one to say that I wasn't even aware of a supermajority for a special meeting. The other thing is can we start getting the citizen's comments after the meeting so we can keep them in our records?
- Mayor answers with what you are requesting it is their personnel information that will probably have to be redacted.

- Mr. Wilkerson interrupts with I wouldn't mind having the redacted version with just their name, not the address or anything.
- Mayor answers if I was just to scan them to you I have their emails and everything I
 would just have to talk to the attorneys and see if that is something we can redact and
 send them to your fellow council members. So you can follow up with their comments.
- Mr. Ruszkiewicz asks open the citizens comment are we not allowed to answer the comments?
- Mayor's answers no because it's not an action item.
- Mrs. Parker I would like to remind everyone to read number nine to remind everyone that we do have a budget workshop.
- Mr. Wilkerson asks with the meeting coming up workshops coming up do we need tables down here do you have some? If not I do have some foldable tables.
- Mayor stated I will defiantly look into getting some tables for everyone and speaking on
 the attendance if you're not going to be here then you do have to inform the city secretary
 prior to the meeting because if we do not have the correct number of people then we need
 to know immediately.
- David lowe asks what happened to the Taubert firm?
- Mayor asks if we would like to talk offline and says well I can say there are people in this city that are not nice and the most hurting thing that I had to hear from that night from her husband after they came and sat in my office they asked: "Are we safe?" That broke my heart for people that had never been to this city asked are we safe and I assured them yes they are safe and that is the question that hit me! First impressions are lasting impressions and that is the first impression they had. A lot of people don't like change but change is good. It might hurt but it is good it is a part of the process. If someone doesn't want to change and doesn't want to grow you have to ask yourself why? Why do people just want to stay the same why not change why not grow? This is not what our city is about and we should do better.
- Mr. Ruszkiewicz says a concern of his is that there are children that are not going to school and have to make an alloy of sacrifice in a family situation and we have to consider that also.
- Mayor states council members look at the full spectrum. The number one thing that will increase at home is the grocery bill. There is a lot going on. People have called and asked me when is this going to end and I wish I had an answer for them but I don't. The second question is how many people in Kempner have it? Well we look at the county not just the city we are in Lampasas county and we do have people that come through here everyday. That is why it is important to practice social distancing and to wear masks.
