## ORDINANCE NO. 2018-03-27-001

(Revision to 2004-04-27-002)

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KEMPNER, TEXAS, PROVIDING THAT THE OFFICE OF CHIEF OF POLICE SHALL BE AN APPOINTIVE POSITION; MAKING FINDING OF FACT; AND PROVIDING FOR OTHER RELEATED MATTERS.

WHEREAS, Texas Local Government Code, authorized the City Council to provide that the office of Chief of Police shall be an appointive position;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KEMPNER, TEXAS THAT:

Section 1. Findings of Fact. All of the above premises and recitations are found to be true and correct and are incorporated into the body of this ordinance as findings of fact, as if copied herein in their entirety.

<u>Section 2</u>. Chief of Police an Appointive Position. The Office of Chief of Police with the City of Kempner, Texas, is hereby declared and ordained to be an appointive position, and not an elective position. The Chief of Police shall be appointed by the Mayor, to serve a two-year term, with approval by Council.

<u>Section 3</u>. Supervision. As with all other Department Heads, the Mayor is declared supervisor for the Chief of Police as well.

<u>Section 4.</u> Open Meetings. It is hereby officially found and determined that the meeting at which this Ordinance was passed was open to the public, and public notice of the time, place, and purpose of said meeting was given, as required by the Open Meetings Act, Chapter 551, Texas Government Code.
