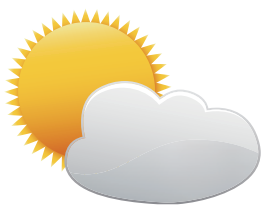

Bulldogs host track meet on April Fool's Day

Wesley Chapel wins the boys title and is the girls runner-up behind Cypress Creek while the Zephyrhills boys finish second and the girls third

Boys and girls track teams from four schools came to Bulldog Stadium on April 1 and it was no prank. Zephyrhills hosted the April Fool's Day meet that included Sunshine Athletic Conference rivals Cypress Creek, Wesley Chapel and Pasco.

The competition served as a barometer for the upcoming postseason. District tournaments begin later this month and will be followed by regional and state meets. Plus, the meet allowed runners and field competitors to meet the Florida High School Athletic Association mandate of participating in at least five meets to be eligible for postseason competitions.

"We have to make sure all of our kids have the mandated minimum," said Bryan Thomas, who coaches the boys team for Zephyrhills. "Down the stretch, if one of your top three or top four get injured one of these kids can fill in."

Wesley Chapel tallied 106 points in the boys meet to finish comfortably ahead of Zephyrhills' 97. Cypress Creek was not far behind at 92 and Pasco was last with a disappointing score of 29.

The girls competition was much closer with Cypress Creek edging Wesley Chapel 87-86. Right behind those teams was Zephyrhills, which netted 85 points. Last-place Pasco totaled 70.

Acknowledging the boys victory that was nearly duplicated by the girls squad, Wesley Chapel coach Greg Hayden noted that there is much improvement needed before the postseason gets underway.

"We're nowhere near close to peaking," said Hayden, who coaches the Wildcats with his wife

Youth football returns to county fields in Zephyrhills

The Xtreme Spring Sports League, which previously scheduled games in Wesley Chapel, now calls the Samuel W. Pasco Recreation Complex home

For years the Zephyrhills Bulldogs of the now-defunct Pasco Police Athletic League played their home games at the Samuel W. Pasco Recreation Complex. More recently, the Wiregrass Lions called that site off Chancey Road home. Both programs played in the fall.

Now, two football fields at that location are utilized for home games in the Xtreme Spring Sports League. That youth football organization, which does not include cheerleading and is now in its fourth season, played home games at Wesley Chapel District Park for three years.

The relocation stems, in part, because the Wesley Chapel Bulls preferred to play home games at that park. Plus, league founder Christopher "L.D." Mattear, who played high school football at Chamberlain in Tampa, lives in

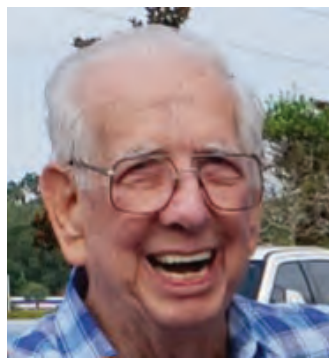

The 13th Annual Betmar Car Show and Cruise didn't have any winners or losers, it wasn't a competition. It was just a lot of people having a blast, while appreciating the past. "That's all we're here for, for fun," said event organizer, Tim Temple. "There's no money involved or anything like that, no top prizes, and no bottom prizes, either." It didn't matter what year your car was. It could be very old, or even a rather recent model. But most of them were quite aged. It was a matter of if you want to clean it up and bring it in, you're welcome. Among the close to 35 participants, they were all either Betmar residents or friends of Betmar residents. For the cruise on Sunday, they took the same route around Betmar that is taken for their Christmas Parade every year. Security guards from Betmar, in a golf cart,

led the parade around the park at two in the afternoon. This was after the cars were lined-up by Temple and others, next to the shuffleboard pavilion. One of the vehicles Sunday that seemed to stick-out, was a green and white 1956 Ford Fairlane Crown Victoria with a glass top. It was proudly being shown by its owners, Paul and Jackie Wilcox. "No matter where we take it, everybody likes it," said Paul. "And this '56 has every single option that Ford had in 1956." It has six-point power seats, air conditioning and rear defrosters, along with what every car seemed to have back then, front vent windows," he added. It was pointed out that those vent windows back then helped to keep cigarette smoke outside, and not around your passengers. Not far from the Wilcox's, sitting in a yellow 1929 Mercedes-Benz, was Tim Temple's wife, Joyce. "It's a replica," she said, "and a man in Plant City built the whole thing." That man's name is Howard Hamil, according to Tim. "This thing has everything," added Joyce. "It has power brakes, power steering; all the good stuff." There were a few trucks at the car show and cruise, as well. One of them was a 1936

Chevrolet pickup driven proudly by Doug Fetterly, who has actually owned the vehicle for nearly 60 years, after having bought it for just \$100. "It then sat in my barn (in upstate New York) for 45-years," he said. "Finally, 15 years later a friend fixed it up for me." Fetterly pointed out that Zephyrhills is known for 'motorheads,' a person who knows a lot about motors. "There are more motorheads in Zephyrhills; stock car guys, drag race guys and antique guys. They're all over the area." Another fascinating automobile to see at the car show at Betmar was the bright red 1951 Buick Convertible, bought by Ralph Kilsdonk, and brought to the show by Ralph and his daughter, Rebecca. "I found it in a barn in Upstate New York, and it was in pieces; really tough shape," said Ralph. "We get a lot of use out of it, too." "I love the car. It's one of many he has done. And, up north, he has a Corvette that he restored, that he's been working on for over 20 years," said Rebecca. Another fascinating vehicle to see at the car show was a 1932 Chevrolet Confederate model, bought by Patrick Maginn, and brought to the show by him and his wife, Lynne. When they're on the road the truck is hauled by a trailer.

"I found it in a barn in Upstate New York, and it was in tough shape," said Patrick. The 1932 Chevrolet Confederate, also known as the Series BA Confederate, was a model only available for the 1932 model year. Once the Betmar cruise through the community was finished, there were a lot of people just mingling around the many historic vehicles and taking pictures. The Jam Band with Bill Bartok took the outdoor stage at 5 p.m., and everyone enjoyed the music with dancing and conversation. Tim Temple, said he is just one member of what they basically call "The Old Car Guy Club." "We do this once a year just for the fun of it," he said. "We don't want to get too big, it's just for entertainment for the people in the park." He added some thoughts on the safety of the Betmar Acres neighborhood and why he's so comfortable with a show like this, and others at Betmar. "I'm going to tell you what. At this park you really don't need to worry. This is really a nice park with a good bunch of people, and that's mainly why I do this; to have camaraderie with everybody getting together for a good time. We do it for the people." He was really happy about this year's car show, the 13th annual one.

Wesley Chapel.

The Bulls, however, are no longer part of the XSSL.

"This is where I was originally going to do it," L.D. said. "We finally got a chance to get out here. They don't have any football presence out here. It used to be real football country out here."

Not far from the fields off Chancey Road, the Zephyrhills Athletic League Dawgs play in fall leagues only at Charles B. Krusen Memorial Field in Zephyrhills.

That site is adjacent to the softball fields that formerly hosted Zephyrhills teams in the Dixie Softball League. The Florida Misfits, a softball travel organization, is based there now.

Aside from the XSSL relocating to Zephyrhills the league has grown substantially since its inception in 2021. That spring, six youth football teams played in the league. Now, there are 30 XSSL teams competing in five divisions—8-and-under, 10U, 12U, 13U and junior varsity high school level—with players primarily from New Tampa, Wesley Chapel and Zephyrhills.

A regular season that lasts for five games in the aforementioned divisions gives young players opportunities to hone their skills in what used to be an off-season. While some young boys who play football opt for a break or to play different sports in the spring, such as baseball or basketball, some prefer another opportunity to play football.

"We're doing the right thing," L.D. said. "All the kids want to come out in the spring to get ready for the fall."

Another factor for the league's popularity is that the rules call for 11-on-11 tackle football. Some other spring leagues throughout the Tampa Bay area are 8-on-8, 7-on-7 are relegated to flag football.

Jorge Torres, a former Wildcats coach who is now on the XSSL's board of directors, noted as much.

"Everybody who turns out to play 11-on-11," said Torres, who also once coached for the Wiregrass Lions, adding, "It's to get the teams ready for the fall."

One of several Wildcat teams went 1-1 this past Saturday. The 13U team defeated Central Elite 8-0 before a 35-0 loss to Spring Hill 352.

In the win, the Wildcats relied on a swarming defense to come up with three key turnovers. Devin Etienne recovered a late fumble as time wound down. Earlier in that game, the Wildcats got interceptions from Matthew Perrone and Dejuan Stanley.

"We had different looks on different coverages," coach Roman Castro Cora said. "We've got 3-4 different coverages and different looks up front."

The Wildcats had the only score of the game, which came in the first half. After stopping Central Elite on downs, quarterback Jacob Decastro scored on a scramble from 5 yards out. He then found Timo DeLoatch in the back of the end zone for a two-point conversion pass.



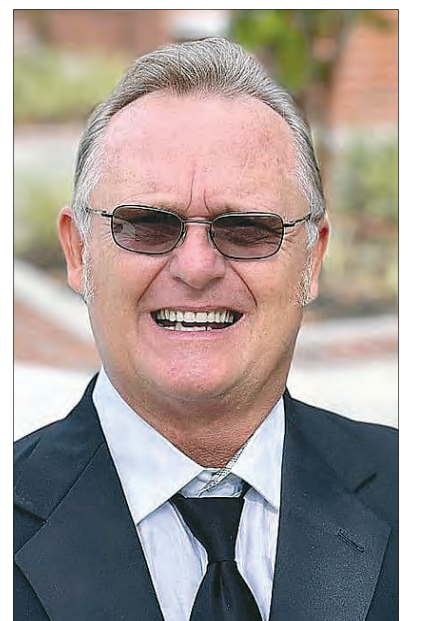

Wrestlers from Zephyrhills, Zephyrhills Christian, Wiregrass Ranch, Wesley Chapel and Cypress Creek advanced beyond regionals

Five local teams capped the high school wrestling season by sending competitors to the state meet, which annually takes place at the Silver Spurs Arena in Kissimmee. Those teams included Zephyrhills, Zephyrhills Christian Academy, Wiregrass Ranch, Wesley Chapel and Cypress Creek.

No school qualified more for the state meet than Zephyrhills Christians' 11. Not coincidentally, the lone state finalists among those five schools also came from ZCA. Talon Maple, who competes in the 144-pound division, and Jeremiah Chavis, at 190, were state runners-up.

In all, nine Warriors were state placers and the team finished third. The others included R.J. Phelan, Izak Rodriguez, Zion Wimberly, Nevin Hayes, Kyle Gallo, Noah Leota, Aiden Hutchins, Curtis Tyler, Javier Lopez, Jeremy Eubanks, Elijah Austin and Emerson Webber.

"Even though we fell short of our goal to be state champs we now have a renewed fire to be better next year," said coach Tim Maple, who is in his third season at ZCA after a long stint at Pasco.

In Maple's three seasons the Warriors finished as a district runner-up in 2022 before winning back-to-back titles at that level. They also won a region championship this season after being the region runner-up last year.

Individually, ZCA had 11 district champions and six region finalists this year.

Zephyrhills had one state qualifier with Jared Apple, a junior at 215, returning to that level for a second straight year. Just like last season, however, he went 1-2 in the state meet. Apple won conference, district and regional titles this year in posting an overall 35-6 record.

Nine other Bulldogs qualified for the

regionals this year. That group included Charles Poole (106 pounds), Hunter Wade (113), Payton Weber (126), Nader Sakka (138), Xaviar Aguirre (144), Caleb Castorena (150), Juliem Toribio (165), Andrew Bray (175) and Lucas Gillespie (285).

Among those wrestlers, Poole, Weber and Sakka were district runners-up while Toribio and Bray were conference runners-up.

While Zephyrhills did not have a great showing at the state meet, coach Mike Martinez was pleased with 10 of his wrestlers advancing to the regionals. That, he noted, bodes well for the future.

"Looking ahead to next season we have a good core of young wrestlers if they continue to stick together," Martinez said.

For Wiregrass Ranch and Wesley Chapel, coaches from those teams praised their female wrestlers with two Wildcats and one Bull qualifying for states in the girls competitions.

Wesley Chapel's Landon Holley, a promising freshman, and sophomore Gabrielle Asabi each went 1-2 at states after placing third at regionals. Holley, who competes at 157, was a district runner-up. At 125, Asabi won conference and district titles.

"They're both young and very athletic," Wesley Chapel coach Daniel Fleshood said. "There's a lot more time for them to be state placers."

Wiregrass Ranch junior Megan Preston was a state runner-up at 170. The three-time state placer was a runner-up at 190 as a freshman and last year placed sixth at 155.

"She's probably one of the hardest workers in the wrestling room," Bulls coach Jamey Ketter said of Preston, who this season also won conference and district championships before finishing as a regional runner-up.

Wiregrass Ranch also had four boys advance to the regionals, none of whom went on to the state level. That group included juniors Tyler Mascarelli (120) and A.J. Beckford (144); along with sophomores Lorenzo Sanchez (138) and Pete Simkins (150).

Additionally, Sean Williams, a junior at 157, won a conference title but did not qualify for regionals.

For Cypress Creek, junior Francesco Alagna qualified for his second state meet.

HOLLYWOOD -- The search for 007 is over. Everyone guessed Tom Hardy, Henry Cavill, Idris Elba, and even this year's Best Actor Oscar winner, Cillian Murphy, but it's Brit-born Aaron Taylor-Johnson who will be Bond ... James Bond!

Cordelia. "It's a win for them. These kids, they work hard."

As for the Bulldogs, Thomas said, "We're a lot better (compared to earlier meets this season) but there's always room for improvement. I feel like we're right on schedule to perform at our highest around postseason time."

The Bulldogs, much as they have done throughout the season, once again dominated in the long distance events. Freshman sensation Lydia Vincent won the 3,200 while Cayden Davis took first in the 3,200 and came in fourth in the 1,600.

Matthew Page, who primarily coaches the long distance runners for Zephyrhills, said victories in several meets by Davis and Vincent give fellow distance runners goals a standard to aim for.

"It's really inspiring to me, and to the other kids as well," said Page, a former standout track and cross country runner at Pasco (Class of 2014). "It really validates what I'm doing and it gives (Zephyrhills runners) a goal to shoot for."

Another distance runner for Zephyrhills,

William Poe III, won the 800 and 1,600. The senior, who also is a cross country standout, was coming off a record-breaking performance at the Florida State Relays in Tallahassee. In that 3,200 race, he ran a 9:29.08 to eclipse a school record that had stood since 1981.

"It's super cool," said Poe III, a University of Tampa commit. "When I crossed the finish line I knew I broke an old record."

Cypress Creek's Allison Wells won the 1,600 and was a runner-up in the 800.

As for the sprints, the boys and girls winners in the 100 were Cypress Creek's Brady Pineo and Wesley Chapel's Tessa Bray, respectively. In the 200, Pasco's Jalissa James won the girls race and the boys winner was Wesley Chapel's Jehlon Lewis.

Earlier in the meet, Zephyrhills' Jakobe Campbell won the triple jump.

Zephyrhills celebrated Senior Night during a break in the meet with family members taking the field with a dozen seniors.
