### Wilkeson, Proctor retain seats in Municipal Election

Alice Hall Community Center was the place to be on April 9 as local residents voted on city council members

Early voting as well as April 9 election day at the Alice Hall Community Center adjacent to Zephyr Park saw more than 1,200 Zephyrhills residents cast their ballots for city leaders.

Four candidates were vying for two seats in the Municipal Election with the victories going to the incumbents. Jodi Wilkeson and Charlie Proctor retained their seats as city council members by warding off challenges from Sam Turgeon and Manny

Mayor Melonie Bahr Monson, a 1979 Zephyrhills High graduate who knows a thing about hometown roots and has seen the city grow and de-

velop over the years, lauded the winners.
"It's a hard thing to beat an incumbent, for sure," said Bahr Monson, who also is a former executive director for the Greater Zephyrhills Chamber of Commerce. "Both Charlie and Jodi do a wonderful job for the city. They're passionate and care a lot

about the city, and I'm happy to work with them."

As for Turgeon, Bahr Monson said, "I think Sam did a wonderful job and I hope he runs again." City manager Billy Poe expressed being bipartisan, reasoning that "I work for whichever candi-

That said, he credited the incumbents for their

always is in the forefront of their decision-making. Wilkeson and Proctor were rewarded with terms that will last for four years. This is Wilkeson's third term and Proctor's sixth.

### Wildcats crack top three in boys weightlifting

Zephyrhills, Pasco and host Cypress Creek each have prominent regional lifters

Zephyrhills High's Malachi Woodard and Rodney Smith won boys weightlifting titles in the Class 2A, Region 3 meet hosted by Cypress Creek. They were among a handful of regional champions from Sunshine Athletic Conference teams that included Pasco, River Ridge, Gulf, Hudson and the host Coyotes.

There were teams from other neighboring counties as well with Lake Wales and Brooksville Nature Coast coming in first and second, respectively.

As for the locals, however, none fared better than Wesley Chapel, which placed third in the traditional division. That came after the Wildcats won conference and district titles in the traditional and Olympic brackets.

"They put a lot of hard work in the last three months and it paid off," said Matt Smith, who is in his first year







### **MOMENTS IN TIME: The History Channel**

\* On April 29, 2004, the World War II Memorial opened in Washington, D.C. The granite and bronze monument stands on 7.4 acres on the former site of the Rainbow Pool at the National Mall, between the Washington Monument and the Lincoln Memorial.

\* On April 30, 1993, tennis player Monica Seles was stabbed between the shoulder blades by Gunter Parche during a match in Hamburg. Parche, a fan of German tennis star Steffi Graf, apparently hoped that by injuring Seles, his idol would be able to regain her No. 1 ranking. On May 1, 1963, Gloria Steinem published the first half of "A Bunny's Tale" in SHOW magazine, recounting her brief stint as a Bunny in Manhattan's Playboy Club. Steinem's under-

cover reporting revealed a culture of misogyny and exploitation behind the glamorous fa-

cade of Hugh Hefner's empire. <sup>c</sup> On May 2, 1924, Patrick Mahon was arrested at London's Waterloo train station on suspicion of murder. He was executed later that year for killing his pregnant mistress, but an important innovation resulted from the crime scene: The officers, who had no gloves, were forced to handle the victim's remains with their bare hands. After the investigation, rubber

gloves became standard equipment at murder scenes. On May 3, 1980, 13-year-old Cari Lightner of Fair Oaks, California, was walking to a church carnival when she was struck and killed by an out-of-control car driven by an intoxicated Clarence Busch. Her death led her mother, Candy Lightner, to found the organization Mothers Against Drunk Driving (MADD), which would grow into one of the country's most in-

fluential nonprofit organizations. On May 4, 1776, Rhode Island, which was founded by the most radical religious dissenters from the Puritans of Massachusetts Bay Colony, became the first North American colony to renounce its allegiance to King George III. It would also be the last state to ratify the new American Constitution more than 14 years later.

On May 5, 1816, the first published poem by John Keats, the sonnet "To Solitude", appeared in the London journal The Examiner. Keats' sadly brief but overall brilliant span of work includes "Ode on a Grecian Urn," "La Belle Dame Sans Merci" and "Ode to a Nightingale."





Supervisor of Elections, Wilkeson narrowly defeated Turgeon, a real estate broker with Sunlight Realty and newcomer to the po-

litical realm, for City Council Seat 3 by a 670-559 margin. Proctor defeated Funes, a former city council member and longtime rival, for City Council Seat 5 by a much wider margin with the final tally at 744-480.

Proctor, who is from Maine and has owned a local auto detailing business for more than 30 years, thanked residents for

their financial commitments to his campaign and their moral support.

"I will continue to look out for the well-being of all of us, not just some of us or special interest groups," he said, adding that he felt privileged "to uphold the values of this growing gitter and the wishes of growing city and the wishes of its residents."

Wilkeson, founder and president of an architectural and interior design firm in Tampa, has resided in Zephyrhills since 1991. Like Bahr Monson, Wilkeson spoke positively of Turgeon, saying, "I had a good opponent. I worked extra

hard.' Part of that hard work was meeting people new to the city. In the past year, nearly 1,000 people have moved to Zephyrhills. That is just part of a growing population that in the past year has included 27,000 new residents in Pasco County, about 6,000 of whom have settled in east Pasco, which includes Zephyrhills, Dade City and the outlying areas.

"Those were the people I needed to meet," Wilkeson said of the new local residents settling into new subdivisions.

The cast at council meetings will remain the same with Wilkeson and Proctor continuing to serve alongside president Lance Smith, vice-president Kenneth Burgess and Steven Spina, who twice previously served as the city man-

Wilkeson and Proctor spoke highly of the current group and how well they seem to work together.

"I don't always agree with my fellow council members but we respect one another," Wilkeson said.

Added Proctor, "I've never seen it get out of hand. That's because we're dealing with a great group of people.

HOLLYWOOD -- A "Pirates of the Caribbean" sequel is in the works, according to producer Jerry Bruckheimer. In a recent interview with ComicBook.com, Bruckheimer said that the current plan is to reboot the franchise completely. (The first five films grossed \$4.5 billion.)

"We're gonna reboot 'Pirates' so that it's easier to put together because you don't have to wait for certain actors," Bruckheimer explained. In other words, he means Johnny Depp, who has fallen from grace because of messy legal problems and won't be returning as Captain Jack Sparrow.

The 60-year-old Depp has now turned to producing and directing. He was originally set to star in "Modì," a biopic about Italian painter Amedeo Modigliani, but he decided to direct the film instead with a European cast. It was mostly shot in Budapest, Hungary, except for Al Pacino's scenes, which were shot in Los Angeles.

Will Smith's comeback film since his Oscar win and infamous Chris Rock slap is "Bad Boys: Ride or Die" with Martin Lawrence, due June 7. Considering "Bad Boys" (1995) grossed \$141.4 million, "Bad Boys II" (2003) grossed \$273.3 million, and "Bad Boys for Life" (2020) grossed \$426.5 million, he's betting that devoted fans will run to see it.

Scott Eastwood, son of Clint Eastwood, calls Hollywood filmmaking "a really weird business" and confesses, "I find a lot of creativity in real estate. Buying and improving homes. ... That's always made me happy." This sounds weird, considering his 93-year-old father would never think about retiring. Young Eastwood has made 28 films, but has yet to break through to stardom.

Yet still, Scott's got three upcoming films: "1992," which stars Tyrese Gibson and the late Ray Liotta; the action/thriller "Tin Soldier," starring Jamie Foxx and Robert De Niro; and "Wind River: The Next Chapter," which is the sequel to "Wind River" (2017). It starred Martin Sensmeier ("The Magnificent Seven"), who reprises his role again for "The Next Chapter," along with Jason Clarke and Alan Ruck.

It's official -- Ken Jennings is the one and only host of everything "Jeopardy!" Viewers were torn between Jennings and Mayim Bialik, but when she informed the show that she'd cease hosting during the writer's strike (which ironically didn't include "Jeopardy!"), the show cut her loose and made Jennings the sole host!
