

# Council members Wilkeson and **Proctor** sworn in

The recent city council meeting began in symbolic fashion when incumbent council members Charlie Proctor and Jodi Wilkeson were sworn in after being reelected.

Wilkeson (Seat 3) begins her third team and Proctor (Seat 5) his sixth with each slated to serve in their respective roles for the next four years. They took their administrative oaths from city clerk Lori

As part of the reorganization, Ken Burgess was announced as the president and officer for the Pasco County Tourist Development Council, along with Proctor being named the vice-president and Ridge League of Cities Liaison.

# **MOMENTS IN TIME: The History Channel**

\* On May 13, 1958, Vice President Richard Nixon's car was attacked and nearly overturned by an angry crowd shouting anti-American slogans as Nixon traveled through Caracas, Venezuela, during a goodwill trip through Latin America. TITLE: None of the car's passengers were injured and the driver was able to speed away to safety.

\* On May 14, 1904, the first Olympic Games to be held in the United States opened in St. Louis, Missouri. The Games had initially been awarded to Chicago, but were later given to St. Louis to be staged in connection with the St. Louis World Exposition. Unfortunately, the Games were poorly organized and overshadowed by the fair.


\* On May 15, 2009, General Electric, one of America's most prestigious corporations, finally began its government-mandated efforts to clean up New York's Hudson River, after decades of environmental damage and legal wrangling. The company had dumped harmful chemicals into the river for years and spent a fortune trying to avoid a cleanup. \* On May 16, 1975, Norma Armistead checked into a Los Angeles hospital with a newborn infant she claimed to have given birth to at home. But when it became clear she hadn't, and another woman turned up dead nearby with the baby she was carrying cut from her body, Armistead was arrested for murder and sentenced to life in prison.

\* On May 17, 1885, Apache leader and medicine man Geronimo escaped from an Arizona reservation. After a year and a half of running, he and his 38 remaining followers surrendered the following September. Geronimo was relocated to Florida before finally being freed two years later.

\* On May 18, 1593, an arrest warrant was issued for Christopher Marlowe after fellow

playwright Thomas Kyd claimed that "heretical" documents found in his room were actually written by Marlowe. Arrested two days later, Marlowe bailed out but died in a bar brawl on May 30. On May 19, 1943, British Prime Minister Winston Churchill and President Franklin Roosevelt set a date of May 1, 1944, for the cross-Channel landing that would become

D-Day. Due to bad weather, it was rescheduled for June 6 instead.



through high school seniors eligible.

'I need a few more good people. I would love to have any of you who would like to be part of the Youth Council," she said. "You need to go to a Zephyrhills school, or an area school, private school, charter school or be home-schooled.

Monson also spoke about how beneficial it would be for a local student, saying, "You will get service hours, you'll learn more about your city government and when you go to apply for college you'll get great recommendations from your city council and from your mayor."

Among several agenda items, the council approved the city's comprehensive plan. That calls for a large-scale amendment to the city's map. It essentially changes zoning designation, dealing with nearly 73 acres of property south of 6th Avenue, west of Chancey Road and east of the Zephyrhills Munici-

After Zephyrhills City Attorney Mathew E. Maggard read the ordinance with nobody coming forward to speak as part of a public hearing.

Tommy-Lee Hunt then spoke about the Trotter's Crossing Subdivision, which council members gave the okay to by a 4-1 vote. The land covers roughly 30 acres, according to Hunt. It is slated for 39 single-family rental units.

That agenda item included an agreement to ensure all onsite improvements such as roads, drainage, water and wastewater lines, and vegetation are working and installed as designed.

The subdivision has been seeded and mulched, with Hunt adding that the project includes a conservation easement with no future development permitted in that area.

Afterward, Zephyrhills City Manager Billy Poe recommended talking about next year's budget. He sought to schedule a workshop with the council to learn about their visions for the coming fiscal year. A May 20 meeting at 5:30 p.m. is planned to begin those discussions.

The next council meeting is scheduled for May 13 at 6 p.m. Because of the Memorial Day weekend later in the month, it will be the only council meeting in May.



### **HOLLYWOOD**

HOLLYWOOD -- The 5-foot-10-inch Jeremy Allen White will become the 5-foot-10-inch Bruce Springsteen for a film adaptation of the 2023 book "Deliver Me From Nowhere: The Making of Bruce Springsteen's 'Nebraska.'" "Nebraska" was the follow-up solo album to Springsteen's hit LP "The River." Springsteen and his manager, Jon Landau, are involved in the making of the film.

White is the star of "The Bear," the FX on Hulu series that won him a Critics' Choice Award, a Golden Globe, a Screen Actor's Guild Award and an Emmy this past award season. He recently starred with Zac Efron in "The Iron Claw," which cost \$16 million and grossed \$44.2 million. He's also completed "You Can't Win," which depicts the experiences of adventurer Jack Black in the hobo underworld.

Bet you didn't know that in 1966, when they were casting the first James Bond film, "Dr. No," they considered Susan Hayward for Bond ... Jane Bond! But Ian Fleming thought they were nuts and instead suggested Richard Burton, who promptly turned it down. Then Fleming wanted Peter Finch, Cary Grant, Dirk Bogarde, Trevor Howard, Rex Harrison, Richard Todd, Michael Redgrave, Patrick McGoohan, Richard Johnson and Roger Moore, who eventually became Bond for seven films.

But when they decided on Sean Connery for "Dr. No," Fleming was shocked because when he met Connery, in his estimation, Connery "couldn't speak the Queen's English!" He said, "He's not my idea of Bond at all. I just want an elegant man, not this roughneck." Luckily, they proved him wrong, and Connery made seven 007 films.

Fleming would have appreciated the fact that 33-year-old Aaron Taylor-Johnson of High Wycombe, England, will become the next 007!

"Bridget Jones: Mad About the Boy" will be the fourth film in the "Bridget Jones" franchise. Two-time Oscar winner Renée Zellweger will return to play Bridget, as will Hugh Grant and Emma Thompson. No word yet on whether Colin Firth will be back, but they've added Chiwetel Ejiofor ("12 Years a Slave") and Leo Woodall (of "The White Lotus").

Firth, meanwhile, will star in "Kingsman: The Blue Blood" with Taron Egerton.

"Titanic" producer James Cameron is still prepping "Avatar 3" for 2025 and "Avatar 4" for 2029, but he's pursuing his dream to remake the 1966 classic film "Fantastic Voyage" with Stephen Boyd and Raquel Welch. The sci-fi film follows scientists who are shrunk to a microscopic size in order to enter the body of an injured scientist via a tiny submarine and repair his brain damage. Cameron admits, "We've been developing it for a number of years and plan to go ahead with it very soon."

Welch was the top Holly-wood sex symbol at the time. (She passed away in February 2023.) The film was built around her sex appeal, and despite her unavailability, Cameron says, "We think we can make a pretty good movie." There just aren't any sex symbols like Raquel Welch around today, but still, they could sell tickets to that casting session!


