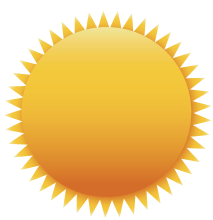

It is getting to be that time of year when the East Pasco YMCA, ACA accredited, the highest accreditation available, is gearing up for their summer camp. It all started with a tour of the camp activities and the Camp Extravaganza for families to preview the activities the camp has to offer.

Upon entering the building kids and families registered with Rachel Petit and Haley Burgos. A large dunk tank was placed beside them and for a couple of dollars you could dunk Alex Delgado, the associate executive director.

"I am going to be dunked all day," said Delgado, eagerly. "We are raising money for scholarships for

children in need to come to summer camp."

In the building, which separates the campers from members, camp activities were being demonstrated. The kids and families got to experience being a camper.

There was a bracelet making station, a table with information for the camp. The Boy Scouts Pack 72 were selling meat sticks. "We are selling smoked snack sticks," said Ryland Moskowitz. "They are \$3."

In the gym basketball was going on. "They are doing a hoop shoot game," said Nicole Bennett, program director, "while they are raising money for the scholarship fund."

In the swimming pool area were swimming lessons.

The activities in the camp will be STEM based activities. With each exercise, there will be a lesson in Science, Technology, English or Math. The STEM activity set up during the tour was how to make ice cream, a math and science activity because of

## Council members Wilkeson and Proctor sworn in

*Local Boy Scout Troop 148 sits in on meeting, which includes zoning approvals for a new subdivision*

The recent city council meeting began in symbolic fashion when incumbent council members Charlie Proctor and Jodi Wilkeson were sworn in after being reelected.

Wilkeson (Seat 3) begins her third team and Proctor (Seat 5) his sixth with each slated to serve in their respective roles for the next four years. They took their administrative oaths from city clerk Lori Hillman.

As part of the reorganization, Ken Burgess was announced as the president and officer for the Pasco County Tourist Development Council, along with Proctor being named the vice-president and Ridge League of Cities Liaison.

Wilkeson is the liaison for Main Street Zephyrhills, Zephyrhills Mayor Melonie Bahr Monson is the liaison for the Zephyrhills Chamber of Commerce with councilmen Lanne Smith and Steve Spina being associated with the Pasco County Metropolitan Planning Council. Spina, a former city manager in Zephyrhills, is the alternate.

Aside from the inner workings of the city during the council meeting, a lighter moment came when Boy Scout Troop 148 was introduced as part of their requirement toward receiving a Citizen in the Community Merit Badge.

They came for an up-close look at how a local government functions with their presence and participation reflecting the importance of civic engagement and youth leadership in shaping the community's future.

Monson called it "a neat little exercise for them in learning about how their government works."

Monson also spoke about the Mayor's Youth Council with local students from seventh-grade

measuring and experimenting with some interesting results.

"The ingredients go in this plastic bag," said Nicole Bennett, program director. "We add half and half, a little bit of vanilla, and sugar. In this bag we have ice, and we are going to add salt. It must be kosher salt."

Salt was added to the bag of ice, then the bag of ingredients placed in the bag of ice. That bag had to be shaken for several minutes. It solidified before your very eyes. It was delicious. During camp, the children will get many different toppings to add to their ice cream.

"We have different age groups that come to camp," said Delgado. "The age groups consist of ages 5 and 6, 7 and 8, and 9 through 12. The camp will go on for 10 weeks with non-stop activities and we have pre-care from 7-9 a.m. before camp."

"The kids start their day in the stage and gaga ball pit area," said Delgado. "In each section of benches surrounding the stage, the different age groups sit to hear what is planned for the day for them and their age group. They love the gaga pit. They take it over."

"They learn team building skills while making friends," said Bennett. "The kids learn different and diverse skills that are age appropriate. While kids learn the games, they teach the

other kids while learning team building."

East Pasco YMCA has basic expectations that would make any parent comfortable with their child attending the camp. The kids will practice safety by walking in lines and staying with their counselors. They learn to act responsibly, clean up after themselves and put things back where they belong. Speaking respectfully means using kind language. The kids will be expected to cooperate with others and listen to adult campers when they are talking.

Every game, craft, sidewalk chalk war, sport, and activity is a lesson with lots of fun added to it. Lunch is served every day through the Pasco Feeding program and the best part of all is the themed weeks planned. A red-carpet event, cowboy and cowgirl week all leads to an exciting event at the end of the week that all the kids prepare for in this fun and safe environment.

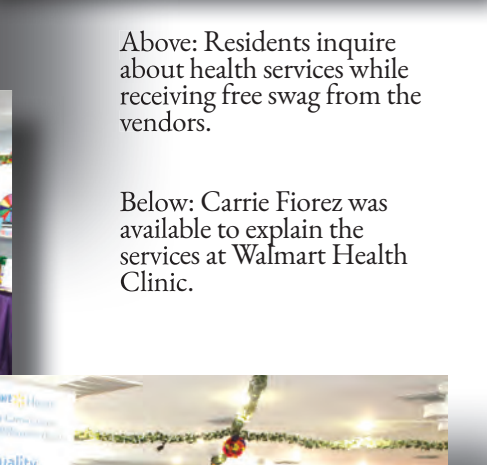

## Youth track and field club wins team title with four individual winners in the Florida Elite Invitational

So far, former Zephyrhills Christian Academy standout Evan Miller who went on to become a notable sprinter at the University of South Carolina, is the most prominent runner to come up through the ranks of the Speed Starz Track Club.

Another standout runner from that club of track and field athletes from Zephyrhills, Dade City, Wesley Chapel and New Tampa, ranging in age from 4-18, who just might be on a similar path is Seth Williamson.

The record-setting sprinter continued his onslaught on meet records by winning the 100-meter dash in the Florida Elite Invitational. The 7-year-old, who has been with Speed Starz for more than two years and already is well known on the state and national circuits, also won the 200 sprint and long jump in that meet hosted by the IMG Academy in Bradenton.

"He's phenomenal," said Speed Starz founder and head coach B.B. Roberts, a formidable sprinter and school record-setter in his heyday at Wesley Chapel High (Class of 2004).

Williamson was among four individual winners — Jakobi Desroches, Lena Budzilek and Wyatt Chapman — to help lead Speed Starz to the team championship. Nearly 40 athletes represented Speed Starz.

"It makes the kids feel good," he said. "It gives them positive vibes. It gives them motivation to win and believe in themselves."

Roberts ranked that overall victory, which included 1,500 athletes and came against strong teams from Florida, Georgia, Maryland and other states, among the most notable since the club was founded in 2013.

That year, just four members ran at the Pasco Middle School track. Now, the club lists nearly 60 members who train at Cypress Creek High, where Roberts coaches.

"We put a lot into it and the program has grown. The kids have gotten more competitive over the years," said Roberts, who is joined by assistant coaches John Rosson, Curlin Beck, Crystal Shields and David Langford.

The other individual winners for Speed Starz were Desroches who competed in the 9-and-under division and won the 100 and long jump to go along with being a runner-up in the 200.

"He's improved as well," Roberts said. In the 11-and-under bracket, Lena Budzilek placed first in the 80-meter hurdles and second in the 1,500, a long distance race.

Lastly Wyatt Chapman, who is 18 and a 2023 Wiregrass Ranch High graduate, competed in the college open category. He won two sprints, the 100 and 200.

Roberts is working with college coaches and scouts in an effort to get Chapman on a running team at the next level. When he was in high school there were no local running clubs to assist with placing him with a college.

"We didn't have that when I was a kid," Roberts recalled. "I wish we had something like that."

A neighboring club, the Wesley Chapel/New Tampa Mustangs has a pair of champions as well. Michael Oliver won the 1,500m in his 14-year-old age group and Meeko Oliver, 9, won in that same distance of his age group. Michael Oliver also finished second in the 800.

Wesley Chapel High sophomore runner Adrianna Rodriguez, competing in the varsity division, starred for the Wildcat contingent in winning the 200 and the 400 in a career-best 57.14 seconds. Both times came in just under the standard for what MileSplit considers an elite performance.

Andres Flores finished second in the 800.

Additionally, Miraya Thomas of Speed Starz won the 100 at the University of South Florida Invitational in Tampa.

through high school seniors eligible. "I need a few more good people. I would love to have any of you who would like to be part of the Youth Council," she said. "You need to go to a Zephyrhills school, or an area school, private school, charter school or be home-schooled."

Monson also spoke about how beneficial it would be for a local student, saying, "You will get service hours, you'll learn more about your city government and when you go to apply for college you'll get great recommendations from your city council and from your mayor."

Among several agenda items, the council approved the city's comprehensive plan. That calls for a large-scale amendment to the city's map. It essentially changes zoning designation, dealing with nearly 73 acres of property south of 6th Avenue, west of Chancey Road and east of the Zephyrhills Municipal Airport.

After Zephyrhills City Attorney Mathew E. Maggard read the ordinance with nobody coming forward to speak as part of a public hearing.

Tommy-Lee Hunt then spoke about the Trotter's Crossing Subdivision, which council members gave the okay to by a 4-1 vote. The land covers roughly 30 acres, according to Hunt. It is slated for 39 single-family rental units.

That agenda item included an agreement to ensure all on-site improvements such as roads, drainage, water and wastewater lines, and vegetation are working and installed as designed.

The subdivision has been seeded and mulched, with Hunt adding that the project includes a conservation easement with no future development permitted in that area.

Afterward, Zephyrhills City Manager Billy Poe recommended talking about next year's budget. He sought to schedule a workshop with the council to learn about their visions for the coming fiscal year. A May 20 meeting at 5:30 p.m. is planned to begin those discussions.

The next council meeting is scheduled for May 13 at 6 p.m. Because of the Memorial Day weekend later in the month, it will be the only council meeting in May.

Firth, meanwhile, will star in "Kingsman: The Blue Blood" with Taron Egerton.

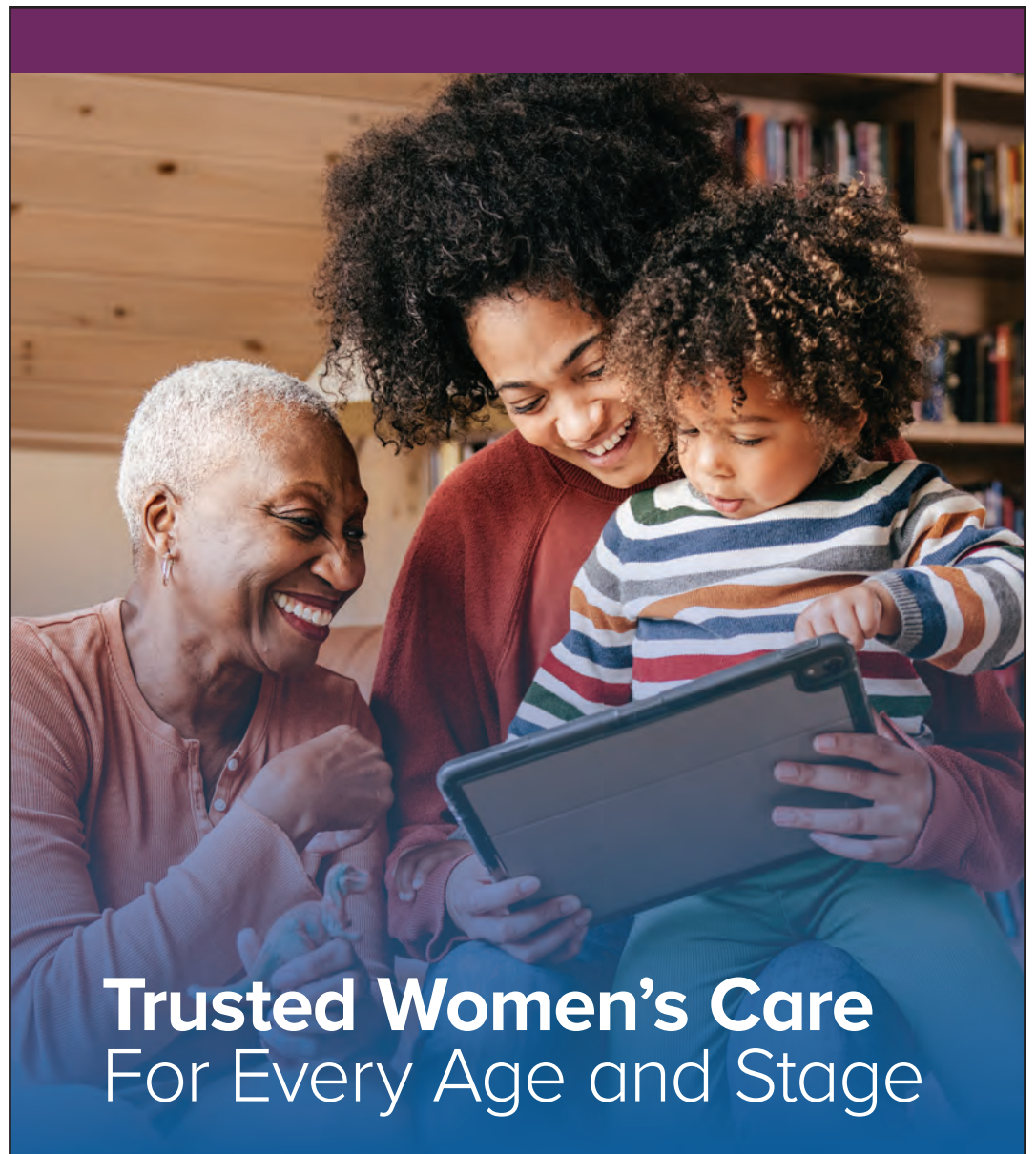
