

Pastor's Notes

Last Wednesday we began the Penitential Season of Lent with the observance of Ash Wednesday (which happened to be also Valentine's day).

This forty day journey should remind us of the graciousness and mercy of our God, and His transformative power, because "he is slow to anger, rich in kindness, and relenting in punishment." (Joel 2:13)

The "ashes" we received on our foreheads was a reminder that we are from dust and to dust we shall return. Our lives are nothing without God. Away from Him, we have no life.

Every year, we are summoned to return to the Lord. To show our sincerity of repentance, we are asked to do penance, to live out the Gospel and to do these three traditional practices - fasting, praying and alms giving.

This reminded me of an experience during my early years here in the United States. CCD students eagerly handed me their "Rice Bowl" boxes. Since it was my first time to hear about the "Rice Bowl" boxes, I really thought the boxes indeed contained grains of rice. Instead, I heard coins clanging inside.

Then the kids shared their personal stories about how they got their boxes filled and how they felt in the process. Because of their ages, getting the boxes filled with pocket change is not an easy task. All of them had to save a quarter (a nice portion of their spending money) every day. Each had to "give up" something just to reach their goal.

The more coins they put in, the heavier the box got and the happier they felt. They realized the value of sacrificing something for a greater cause --- and that is to help feed children like them who barely have anything and are starving every day.

That day, I witnessed how the children were changed for the better by their own experience. I can also tell you that because their sharing, I came out of that classroom a changed person.

This Lent, there are many "little sacrifices" we can do that are very helpful to our souls. As we journey towards heaven, let us remember that the way of the cross does not end in despair, but in the promise of a new life. Let us then open ourselves to the transformative grace of God in our lives.

What will you give up this Lent?
