Seventh Sunday of Easter

First reading - Acts 1:15-17,20-26 - 'Let someone else take his office'

Responsorial Psalm - Psalm 102(103):1-2,11-12,19-20 - The Lord has set his sway in heaven.

Second reading - 1 John 4:11-16 - Anyone who lives in love lives in God, and God lives in him

Gospel Acclamation - cf.Jn14:18 - Alleluia, alleluia! I will not leave you orphans, says the Lord; I will come back to you, and your hearts will be full of joy. Alleluia!

Gospel - John 17:11-19 - Father, keep those you have given me true to your name

Consecrate them in the truth

On this seventh Sunday of Easter, we continue to read the gospel of John, chapter seventeen. This chapter comes at the end of Jesus' farewell discourse to his disciples at the last supper. The whole chapter is Jesus' prayer for his disciples. In the prayer Jesus commend himself to his Father and expresses his care and concern for his disciples. At the end of the prayer, Jesus and his disciples leave for the garden, where Jesus is arrested.

There are many important lessons in Jesus' prayer. In this prayer Jesus reaffirms the complete union between himself and the Father. Throughout the gospel John presents Jesus as the one who pre-existed with the Father and as the one sent by the Father to do his work on earth. In today's gospel reading, we hear Jesus includes all his disciples in this union with Father. We are reminded that Christ is the source of Christian unity. Through Christ we are united with one another and with God our Father. In his prayer Jesus describes part of his mission in the language of protection. He has protected his disciples, those who were given to him by the Father. Now that he is returning to the Father, he prays that his disciples will continue to be protected from the evil one.

The disciples are in the world, but they do not belong to the world. Yet like Jesus, they are sent into the world for the salvation of the world. Jesus knows that the world may not accept his disciples, because the world prefers darkness. According to John, salvation is worked out through the cosmic battle between light and darkness. Yet the light will not be overcome by the darkness.

Reading this prayer of Jesus during the Easter season, through the lens of his resurrection, we know that the light of Christ has overcome the darkness of sin and death in our world. Therefore, we are challenged to remain in Jesus Christ. To be consecrated in the Truth, the word God.


Palmer Partnership News
