There they bought another and that made four.


Four little gingerbread men feeling so alive. Rounded up another and then there were five.


Jessica's Corgi Corner

From The Admin Team

Just a reminder that ECP (Emergency Control Procedure i.e. physical holds) like holding a client's arms down, pinning them down, holding their arms behind their back, wrapping your arms around a client to restrict their movement, etc is against company policy. The ONLY acceptable reason to do an ECP is to protect against loss of life or limb. Use coping skills like deep breathing, blowing bubbles, giving space, taking a break, or any other coping skill to deescalate a situation. If a client is trying to be aggressive with you, try to put distance and/or furniture between you and the client to protect both of you. Call 911 if you feel you cannot get the situation under control, and it is dangerous for you or the client. If you use an ECP, you must contact admin immediately to inform us and file an incident report immediately after the shift. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact the Compliance Team. You can also review the training in the staff portal.
