Happy Optimist New Year!!!! October 1 marks the start of a new fiscal year for the Optimist Club. So, toot **YOUR** horn in celebration of the accomplishments of this past year and the **100**th **Anniversary of Optimist International**. Going forward, here are the goals that were presented to the board for the coming year:



- First and foremost, remember our mission. It's about the youth of the community that are impacted by club projects and activities.
- Continue to do the club's current projects well and improve where needed.
- Consider new opportunities. New projects currently in the planning stages:
 - Tea Party (mother / daughter) possibly in May. Using the tea set received from Mercy Hospital for a small donation.
 - The School Lunch Investigative Committee is still considering how the club can provide assistance with the school lunch debt.
- Maintain and grow our current membership.
 - As of September 30, 2018, there were 108 members on the club roster. One of the criteria to be an Honor Club is to end the year with a net +3 members. For a Distinguished Club, the club has to meet the all the criteria of an Honor Club and add at least 15 new members or build a new club. Considering that members may leave for a variety of reasons, such as, move away, financial, etc., then the club has to add 3 new members just to maintain the net number.
 - Optimist International (OI) has rolled out two recruitment promotions for the 2018-2019 year. One for teachers (or other school-related positions) and one for any new members who are age 30 and under.
- Accountability and transparency to donors. An annual report reflecting how
 many children are impacted by club projects is being finalized for distribution
 to donors as well as new members.
- Overall, fundraising efforts should be for the good of all projects that the club has committed to and not specific to one project.
- Increase attendance at quarterly Zone and District meetings and the International Convention in Louisville, KY in July 2019.

More information will be shared about these goals, projects, etc. throughout the year! I am looking forward to working with all you in these endeavors!


