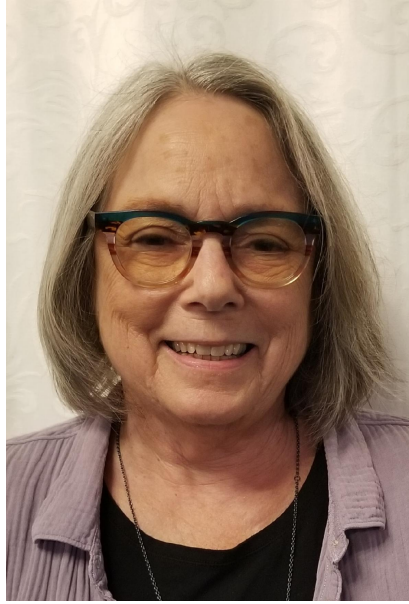

### Luncheon Meeting February 1, 2024

The February 1, 2024 meeting's guest speaker was Rebecca Bishop, Executive Director of the Jefferson County YMCA. Rebecca shared with the group a behind-the-scenes view of the charitable work of the Jefferson County YMCA. She said the Y is more than just sports and sweat, that it provides many other opportunities for the health, well-being, and social needs of the Festus community.

*(From their website: The Y is more than a gym. We're the leading nonprofit committed to strengthening our Festus community.*

*We are proud to serve this great community through programs and services that focus on Youth Development, Healthy Living, and Social Responsibility. From athletics to academics, the Y offers a great variety of activities that help individuals of all ages and abilities grow strong in spirit, mind, and body.)*

Rebecca said that the Jefferson County branch is one of 24 in this region and that membership at this branch also provides access to others in the region. About 2,000 members have insurance-based membership through such programs as Silver Sneakers.

The Y employs 180 people, most of whom are young adults, which provides them with job skills and responsibilities such as: supervision, record keeping, interacting with people of all ages and abilities, and timeliness.

Programs and services offered at the Y include, but are not limited to: fitness classes, personal training, and healthy lifestyles. Classes for people of various medical concerns like Parkinson's disease, cancer,

high blood pressure, diabetes are available. Specific classes provide time and activities for groups with special needs like Pony Bird. Swim lessons, exercise, and water safety/lifeguard training are offered. Childcare while parents/guardians are using facilities, summer camps, before/after school enrichment at four local school campuses, and school's out camp when school is not in session due to weather or teacher workdays is provided.

Social opportunities, for seniors in particular, include the Morning Coffee Crew who exercise and then spend the next few hours conversing over a cup (cups!) of coffee, going on day trips, sharing monthly potlucks and playing bridge and chess.

The Y also participates in Twin City Days with a 5K run as well as a Turkey Trot.

As all non-profits, they are nearing the end of a campaign to raise \$89,000 by March and are nearing that threshold.

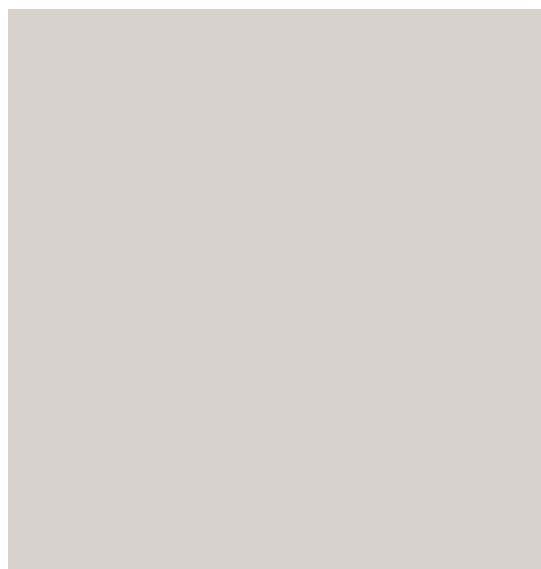

## Weekly Breakdown



### Brenden's Friday Backpacks February 15, 2024.

At today's meeting, I got to be the speaker and talk about Brenden's Friday Backpack program. Joining me were fellow volunteers. Brenden's Friday Backpacks is a 501(c)(3) non-profit, charitable organization whose mission is to "feed

hungry kids over the weekend." Brenden's Friday Backpacks began in 2011 with four children in one school and has grown to a program that is currently feeding over 1,750 children in 60 schools in Jefferson County EVERY week during the school year. Every Friday, each child takes home a bag of single-serve, non-perishable, kid-friendly foods that are easy to prepare and will last them through the weekend.

The program is run entirely by volunteers and operates on anonymous referrals directly from local schools. Brenden's Friday Backpacks operates on donations from individuals, local businesses, schools who hold food drives, and religious or civic organizations. They also receive a grant from Jefferson Foundation and the Katherine M. Buder Charitable Foundation.

After our meeting, our club put together snack packs, which consisted of one fruit item and three snack items in a Ziploc bag. We made up 416 snack packs to donate to Brenden's!! Way to go Optimists!! As for our EMO 2nd quarter service project, Optimist Club members brought in lots of donations of food for Brenden's Friday Backpacks. Before our meeting today, members had donated 168 pkgs/boxes of food which equaled 2,091 individual items.

Debbie Hogenmiller and I went shopping with budgeted funds of \$1000 and purchased 82 pkgs/boxes of food which equaled 3,352 individual items. Total numbers: 250 pkgs/boxes = 5,443 individual items plus more uncounted donations that were brought to today's meeting. On behalf of Brenden's Friday Backpacks, I would like to say THANK YOU, THANK YOU, THANK YOU for your generosity and support of this program!

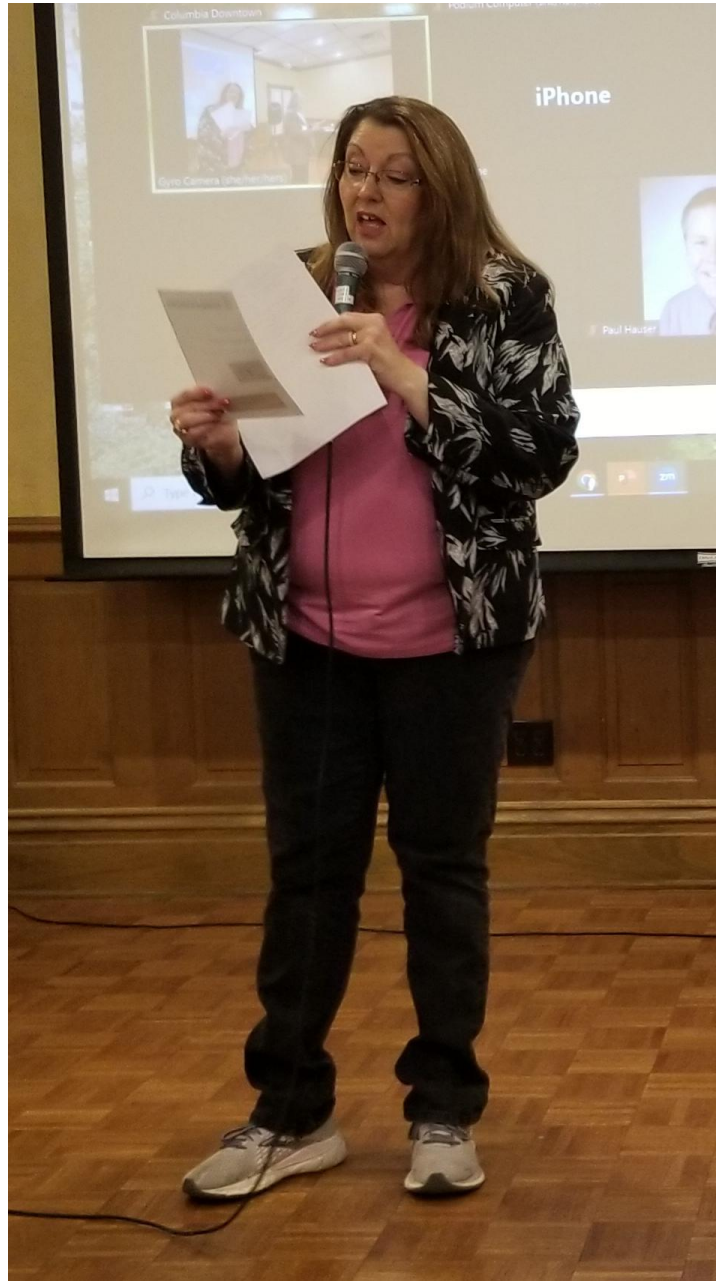
