

# Ordinance No. 6.

Prohibiting drinking liquors, drunkenness, profanity, disorderly conduct, card-playing, and the congregating or loafing of persons on the sidewalks, and in front of stores, houses, churches, and upon the streets, - avenues, lanes alleys, highways, commons, or uninclosed lots of land within the limits of the Borough of Patterson Heights.

Be it enacted and ordin- ed by the Town Council of the Borough of Patterson Heights, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, as follows:

Section 1. That from and after September 1, 1901, it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to engage in drinking ale, cider, beer, wine, whiskey, or any admixture thereof, or any other malt, vinous, or spirituous liquors

of any kind whatsoever, upon  
the streets, avenues, lanes, alleys,  
highways, commons, or uninclosed  
lots of land within the limits  
of this borough.

That from and after September  
1st, 1901, it shall be unlawful for  
any person or persons, to engage  
in wanton hallooing, yelling, or  
fame or vulgar language, and  
all kinds of disorderly conduct  
whatsoever, or for any person  
or persons, to congregate or loaf  
in front of stores, houses, church  
places of public meeting, or to

indulge in card-playing upon  
the streets, avenues, lanes, alleys,  
highways, commons, or uninclosed  
lots of land within the  
limits of this borough.

Section 3. Any person violating any of the provisions of the Labor Ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, before the burgess, or any justice of the peace, forfeit and pay for the use of the said borough, a fine of not less than 1, nor more than 25 dollars for each and every offence, together with all costs, and to undergo an imprisonment in the county jail for a period not exceeding 20 days, either or both, at the discretion of the burgess or justice of the peace.
