

Ordinance No 22

Of the Borough of Patterson Heights
Prohibiting the placing of brush, paper
dirt, manure, slops or other offensive
matter on the streets or alleys of the
Borough.

Be it enacted ^{by} ordained by the Town
Council of the Borough of Patterson
Heights and it is hereby enacted
and ordained by the authority of
the same.

First:- That from and after the
1st day of January A.D., 1911 it shall
be unlawful for any person or
persons to put, or cause to be
put or placed upon any public
street or alley, any timber, brush,
paper, stone, dirt manure, slops or
other offensive or unnecessary
substance, without first having permission
so to do from the Street Commissioner

Provided that Bricks, stone, timber
and other material intended to be
used in building or repairing may
remain on said streets or alleys
when necessary for a reasonable
length of time, provided that
the free passage of the same is
not obstructed thereby ^{by} that not
more than half of the street or alley
be occupied therewith.

Second. That from and after the said date, it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to burn or cause to be burned any wooden boxes or other rubbish, except paper straw leaves, or other light substance, upon any of the streets of said Borough.

Third

That from and after said date it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to put or place or cause suffer or permit to be placed; or left upon any street or alley in said Borough any wagon, buggy carriage or other vehicle except when being used, and then not to remain thereon for a longer period than six hours.

FOURTH:-

That from and after this date it shall be unlawful for any person or persons using awnings in front of their places of Business in said Borough to allow same to be less than seven ^{feet} ~~by~~ one half (7½) feet above the level of the pavement on Sidewalk.

FIFTH.

It shall be the duty of the High Constable or other duly appointed officers of said Borough to enforce the provisions of the foregoing and other ordinances, ~~by~~ when their fees are not provided for, they shall be the same as the fees of the Constable for similar service.

SIXTH

Any person or persons violating any of the provisions of the foregoing ordinance shall be on conviction thereof before the Burgess of said Borough forfeit and pay to the said Borough a fine of not less than (\$2⁰⁰) dollars nor more than twenty five (\$25⁰⁰) dollars, and costs for each and every violation thereof, and in default of such payment, the said Burgess may commit the person or persons so offending to the County Jail for a period not exceeding thirty (30) days
