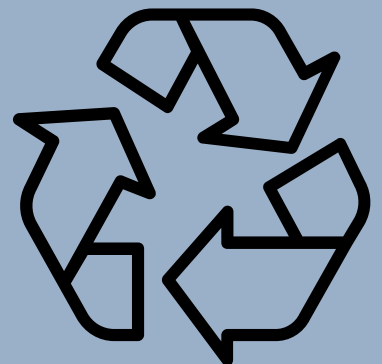
HOW TO GET INVOLVED?

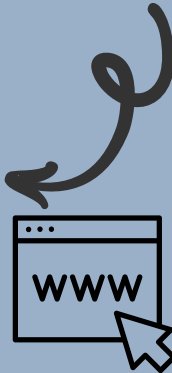

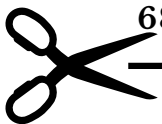
MOBILE SAFETY

Lincoln Community Notification System is now available to all residents. Lincoln Community Notification System is a free service that allows individuals to sign up for notifications sent from state and local authorities. Lincoln Community Notification System keeps residents and travelers informed on potentially hazardous situations involving weather, traffic and other emergencies.

"Lincoln Community Notification System enables authorities to notify the community in real time," said Melissa During, Supervisor. "This service allows for critical communication with the public and provides individuals with the information needed to stay safe or take precautions during hazardous or emergency situations."

Lincoln residents and travelers can also download the Smart911 app to sign up for Lincoln Community Notification System to receive key information needed in an emergency. The Smart911 app provides enhanced functionality by sending targeted alerts based on the user's location. Smart911 app users will receive the highest priority National Weather Service alerts including tornado warnings, flash flood warnings, and severe thunderstorm warnings based on their real-time location. Download the Smart911 App on the Apple Store or Google Play or by texting "Smart911" to 67283. Residents may also sign up for non emergency notifications such as town road closure, meeting updates, lost & found dogs, and more.

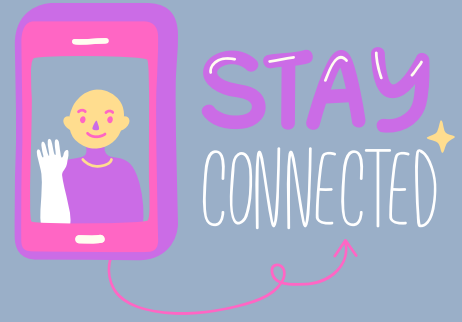
