A Message from Brant

November is about thanksgiving, and fittingly, about our stewardship of all God's blessings! In keeping with these themes, November is also the month that your church asks you to consider making a pledge for the coming year (2014) as a response of faithfulness, and to allow the Session to make responsible financial plans for the coming year. Here are a couple of important things to know in that regard:

1) THANK YOU! The Current Fund, which we use to pay the basic expenses of the church, has been stable through 2013, and we appear to be on track to finish the year with a balanced budget. If you are already tithing, then you know the unique joys of that discipline, and **if you aren't quite to the ten percent mark, then you are invited to make an incremental increase in your giving** (perhaps 1-2%). About 15% of our givers are estimated to be tithers. If everyone else can increase their giving toward becoming a tither, FPC should be able to fund all existing mission, ministry, and programing planned for the coming year.

It is good that we pause to remember with thanksgiving all that we have received, and that we plan for how we will share those blessings with others in the year ahead.

2) THANK YOU! The Building Fund, which we use to pay the mortgage and to make capital repairs and improvements, has also been strong. As you may recall, for the past two years the Session has asked us to make a special capital fund pledge for the Fellowship Hall Extreme Make Over, which was to be finished at the end of 2013. All things being equal, we would be ready to move forward on that project in early 2014 because you have been so faithful. The sanctuary incident this past spring, however, revealed a problem in the primary electrical panel (not part of the incident) that must be addressed sooner than later, and that is best addressed in connection with the Make Over project. **IF you would be willing to extend your Building Fund pledge at current levels for one more year, we would be able to cover the costs of this unexpected repair and complete the Make Over.** Furthermore, IF members will make those pledges, the Finance Committee will recommend to the Session that the repairs and Make Over be done out of the first dollars to the Building Fund, in the belief that members will continue to give to the project even though it is done (in order to then cover other things the Building Fund must cover for the rest of the year). Essentially this means that if pledges are strong, we could be doing the Extreme Make Over in the first part of the year as planned!

God has blessed each and every one of us in so many ways. It is good that we pause to remember with thanksgiving all that we have received, and that we plan for how we will share those blessings with others in the year ahead!

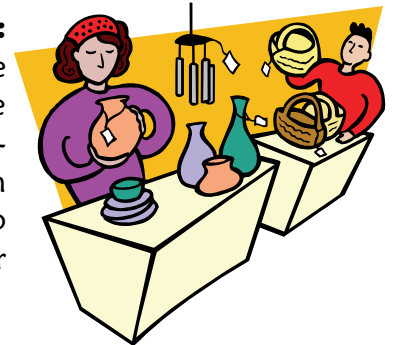
