A Message from Brant

On January 5th at 3:00 p.m. the third annual Mesa-Gilbert Prayer Walk will take place (!). As you can imagine, it is a massive undertaking: last year twenty churches and hundreds of walkers hit the streets and prayed for our civic leaders, our first responders, our schools, our businesses, our families, and all that our cities contain, asking for God's protection and prosperity in the year ahead.

This year FPC will split our group and cover two of the segments. Please plan on taking part by meeting at 3:00 at the southeast corner of Brown and Country Club (park at the Mesa Student Services building, 1025 Country Club, just south of the intersection), to walk and pray with fellow church members (for more information on prayer walking go to www.mesaprayerwalk.org).

But wait, that's not all! It seemed like a natural idea to merge the Mesa Prayer Walk with the prayer walk of our campus, so I wonder if some of us, after walking and praying for the city, would like to return to FPC, spend a few more minutes walking and praying specifically for our church (its people, programs, protection, and direction) in the year ahead. THEN, let's stick around and have some kind of crock pot meal together (nothing fancy, but a few folks are working on something that will be hot and nourishing for us).

What do you say? Come on out for a little physical and spiritual exercise, and let's start the year off right!
