Peace and Global Witness Special Offering — Thank you for your generous giving which totaled \$2,070. \$517.50 was sent to our mission partners at the border. \$1,035 was sent to PCUSA. And \$517.50 was sent to Grand Canyon Presbytery.

International Mission Trip — The trip to the US-Mexico border ministry in Aqua Prieta at Frontera de Cristo will be the week of March 9-15. The planning has begun. Pastor Ann, Ellen and Ayden Hickey, Shelley

Cronenberg, Marci Snitzer, Peter and Sue Eisenklam are your Planning Team members and can answer questions. Statement of Mission Trip Interest forms plus a \$25 fully refundable deposit are due by December 2nd. Sue has forms if you haven't gotten one yet. The completed paperwork, with half of the mission cost (yet to be determined, approximately \$200-\$300), is due on January 9th. The remainder of the cost is due February 9th. Training sessions for participants will begin in January. Congregational surveys to extend opportunity to support the mission trip will be given out in January. FROM THE CLERK'S DESK

News from the September Session meeting.

A complete list of current elders and deacons and the commission they belong to can be found in the La Palabra, listed in each commission's news.

- Several of the presenters at the Ministry Fair in Worship on October 21st were very pleased with the response for help they received.
- Ann reported that the YMCA has been sold to Chicanos Por La Causa and it will now be a neighborhood help center.
- Robert Harding has been selected by the Presbytery of Grand Canyon as the recipient of this year's George Brooks Award. He will receive it at the November 3rd presbytery meeting at Chandler Presbyterian Church. Congratulations, Robert!
- The membership of the church stands at 286.
- The Space Utilization Task Force's Phase One campus updates will begin right after Thanksgiving. Look for a Bulletin Insert entitled A Season of Thankfulness for ways that you can help.
- We are in conversation with a 5G cell tower company to see if our campus will meet their criteria to install a 5G cell tower.
- There will be a Congregational Meeting on Sunday, November 18th, to approve Ann's Terms of Call.

You can make a charitable contribution directly from your IRA if you are at least 70 ½ during the year. The Required Minimum Distribution is not taxable if you make the distribution directly from your IRA to the Church or any charitable organization. The reason to do this is simple.....taxes. You do not have to report the RMD as income therefore most people will save tax dollars. The tax law changed this year and most people will not be able to itemize their deductions. So, if you give \$1,000 directly to the church from the IRA you do not have to declare this as income. If you are in the 15% tax bracket you save \$150 in taxes. You have a choice to pay an extra tax to the government or not. If you have not taken your RMD this year then this is a wonderful way to take the distribution. Maybe you have already done your RMD this year, then in January take your RMD for 2019 by doing the charitable contribution directly from your IRA.
