What started as a potential dream over a year ago is quickly becoming a reality. Many thanks to the fourteen parishioners and others who attended the mentor training program for Saint Peter's new ministry, Check and Connect. The vibrant training was led by two educators, Emily Bland and Maria Morris, as well as, Ashley Padgett, all from the Beaufort County Schools (BCS) administration.

Check and Connect is a comprehensive intervention designed to enhance student commitment at school and with learning for marginalized, disengaged students, through relationship building, problem-solving, capacity building, and persistence. Recognizing that multiple influences – home, school, and community – have on student disengagement, mentors will work to create positive relationships to provide consistent standards for educational performance and supports for students to attain them.

Developed by the University of Minnesota, Check and Connect is a data-based intervention to assist young students at risk of dropping out of school at the age of sixteen by developing meaningful one-on-one relationships with school-identified students. By creating personal relationships, this ministry has the proven potential of changing the lives of both the volunteer and the student. Mentors from Saint Peter's will partner with fourth and fifth-grade children from John Small School.

Teachers and administrators are currently in the process of identifying students and obtaining parental consent for the child's involvement in Check and Connect. Mentors from Saint Peter's will gather with students, parents, teachers, and administrators in early March for introductions and establishing relationships.

Although this is not an evangelical program, this is an exciting time in the life of our parish as we begin this new ministry to bring the power of God's love to those children through our acts of friendship, care, and concern. Please hold all of those involved in Check and Connect in your prayers as we begin a new journey.





FYI: Each bundle for each child each week contains 2 canned meats, 2 canned vegetables, 2 milks, 2 noodle products, 2 breakfast items, two snacks, 2 juices, 2 canned fruits, and one fresh fruit. This food is sent home with the children to supplement weekend nutritional needs. The teachers note considerable improvement in the children's performance and attention as a result of this assistance.

The EES Guidance Counselor commented recently: "I wish you could see the kids' faces when they are given their food on Fridays!"
