Edgar's dad, for many years, cooked for the St. Peter's 7:00 a.m. Wednesday morning prayer breakfast and numerous EYC activities. His mother, Mamie, was active in the church.



Annual Jr Warden's Report 2023

2023 has been a somewhat busy year behind the scenes. First and foremost, innumerable thanks to Riley Roberson and his helpers for their tireless attention to the church grounds. He does an amazing job, and if you're every at church sometime during the week, you'll probably see him working. Accolades also to Jennifer Spivey, without whom the Jr. Warden's job would be tremendously more difficult!

We did complete several planned and unplanned electrical items. The lighting in ASH was replaced. Issues with the lighting in the sanctuary, the walkway, and emergency lighting were addressed. Progress has been made in changing bulbs in the chapel to LED. A motion sensing light was added to the end of the kitchen to provide some additional light.

We contracted an expert to review the climate control of the sanctuary to eliminate reliance on the very old boiler for heating and improve efficiency for cooling. A proposal has been received and is in process of review.

Many missing shingles on ASH created roof leaks that were repaired and some shingles were replaced. We will need to replace all of the shingles soon. Fascia boards and gutters were repaired on Bonner Street side of the main building. Painting in the Handicap parking area was completed to improve safety. Designated visitor parking was created beside the Handicap parking near ASH.

I thank everyone who assisted on these and other items that I have forgotten to mention. It takes a lot to keep our beautiful, old facility in good condition. We're blessed to have willing workers to do it!
