I've recently talked with several people who have said something like this: "I'm scared. The world seems to be getting worse and worse." And by several, I mean at least a dozen. And they're right. It is a scary time to be alive, and it does seem like the world is descending into an abyss from which we can't return. We must name this reality and our experience of it if we want to live honestly in the world.

But we aren't just any group of people. We are St. Peter's Episcopal Church, an oasis of God's love, a part of the Church Universal which has weathered storm after storm. We are the baptized people of God, filled with the Spirit, made righteous and sanctified in the eyes of God. We are the ones who have been commanded to take the goodness of God into every darkened corner of the world. We are the ones who defiantly say to that scary world, "You will not break me."

So, how do we move through these feelings, to arrive on the other side of the shore? For starters, we can look ahead at what's coming around the corner. We are empowered by this most wonderful feast, and we are sent out into the world to cure it with the medicine of Jesus of Nazareth. We carry the message that we have not been abandoned by a distant, indifferent God. Rather, we are joined here in our pain by the One who has already conquered death, hell, and the grave. Through this joining, we have been made more than the sum of our humanity. We are living vessels of the energy that called creation into being and brought new life out of the tomb.

Yes, my friends. The world is scary, and it seems like we are heading towards the point of no return. But together, let us push back against that fear, push back against

the despair that says hope is a fool's errand. Let's be foolish together, and resist with joy the powers and principalities of darkness. Let's offer Thanksgiving, and then worship the Christ Child, and go out and change the world.
