

THE LOCKS AT LOCKPORT

The Locks at Lockport have been enlarged twice since the original ones were built. They were completed for the canal opening in 1825. Boats could haul 75 tons of freight. The locks for Clinton's Ditch were 90' long, 15' wide, and 4' deep. The canal was enlarged, starting in 1835 and was completed in 1862. The locks then measured 110' long, 18' wide, and 7' deep, making it possible for boats to carry up to 240 tons - a sizable increase. The Erie Canal as known today was enlarged between 1905 and 1917. The modern locks now measure 328' long, 45' wide, and a 12' depth of water over the lock sill. This permits boats of a maximum size of 300' long, 43' wide and 11' deep, carrying 2,000 tons of freight to use these new locks.
