LEADERSHIP, GOOD GOVERNANCE AND SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT

Introduction

The debate on the Estimates of Revenue and Expenditure of Saint Vincent and the Grenadines for the financial year 2023, took place on Tuesday 13th December 2022. The Honourable minister of Finance presented on the Estimates and laid out the total estimated figures for the period and as is the practice initiated the debate by giving an overview of where the government intends to raise the revenue and the anticipated expenses over the same period. The debate on the estimates is a confirmation of the priorities of the government over the next year allowing the ministers to detail the focus of their ministries for 2023. We cannot ignore the significance of the period that we are in, even as we can agree that we have made tremendous strides in our recovery efforts made necessary by the challenges of the last 2 years. Listening to the presentations by the members on the government side, it is clear that our Unity Labour Party administration is proceeding with its agenda of sustainable development through the construction of a modern, competitive, many-sided, post-colonial economy, that is at once local, regional and global. The parliamentary opposition remains stuck and unable to propose anything forward thinking, preferring instead to look forward to the past, rewriting history claiming their period of stewardship to be more than it was. The ULP continues to execute its policies through projects and programs at a blistering pace of implementation that is causing much confusion among the members of the opposition who continue to scramble to stitch together talking points in an effort to remain relevant, or at the least, keep their base engaged. Unfortunately, incoherent, overused talking points are finding it difficult to stand up against the reality of good governance, growth and development that our country continues to experience under the ULP, led by our experienced and knowledgeable Comrade Ralph.

Leadership That Works

Poll after poll continue to show that Comrade Ralph is preferred at least 2:1 over any other person in political leadership in SVG, and this view is held even by those who support the opposition. As SVG begins the construction of the modern port in Kingstown and other ongoing construction continues, the result in 18-24 months will be remarkable as we finally begin to see first-hand the fruits of the promised economic take-off. The education revolution has prepared our country to provide the adequately trained workers, both in mainstream academics as well as in the skilled sectors that will be in high demand. We recognize that we need to accelerate further training in other areas, specifically technical vocational areas, and that is being given priority with the creation of the Department of Higher Education with Comrade Ralph as Minister.

Our country's modern, competitive, many-sided, post-colonial economy is taking shape before our very eyes, and it is a direct product of exceptional leadership that understands the role of good governance to drive economic growth and sustainable development.
