SUBJECT:	Adjusted AOMTS Time Resulted in \$80 Over-10 Payment				

DETAILS

Attention - All Canadian T&E Employees

A recent audit identified that a road crew altered their AOMTS time (Arrival Time) in their CMA Tie-Up from that provided by the system which is fed by AEI reader information.

By revising their tie-up, the crew indicated they were on duty over 10 hours upon arrival at the AOMTS. As a result, the crew generated \$80 NR payments for themselves.

A formal investigation has concluded the crew was not on duty over 10 hours when they arrived at the OMTS.

All employees are reminded of their responsibility under the Honour System to ensure that their tie-ups and other wage claims are submitted accurately and in a manner that reflects actual events.

Reminder: If you intend to submit a claim where you are unsure of entitlement, you must use the interpretation claim code (IP) and ensure that complete details are included, such as location and times and other relevant information that will assist the Audit Team in determining if you are entitled to the claim.
