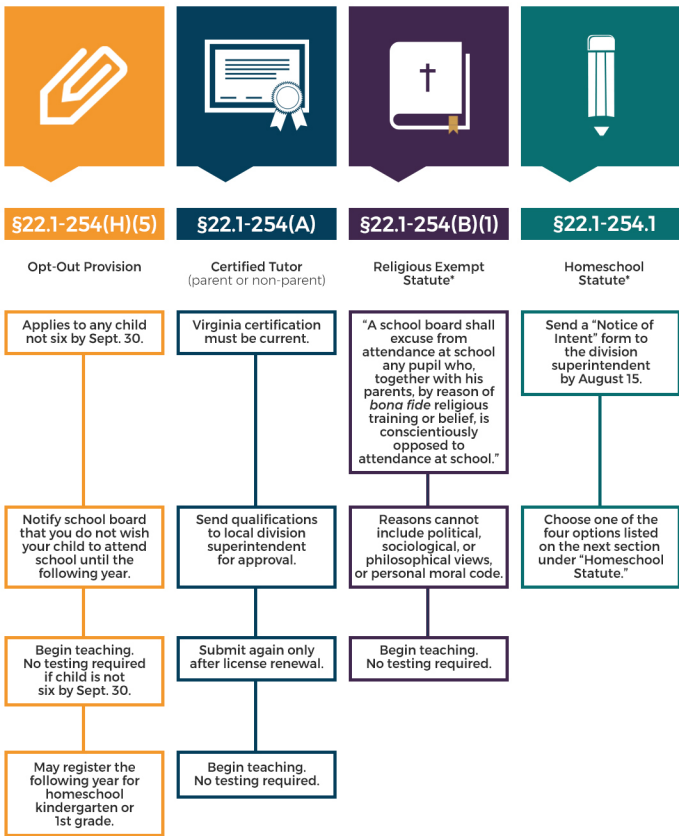


# VIRGINIA HOMESCHOOL LAWS

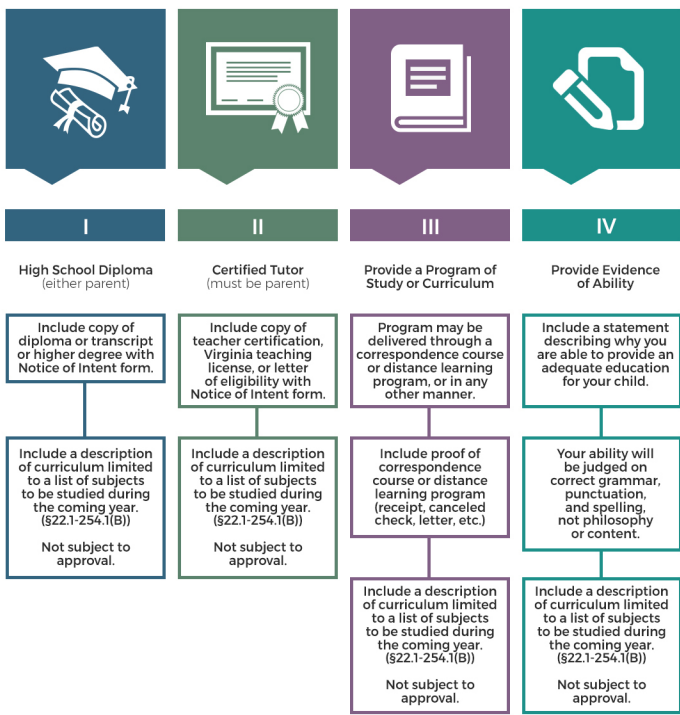
## FOUR OPTIONS AVAILABLE FOR HOME INSTRUCTION



Parents must comply with immunization requirements and maintain records at home according to §22.1-271-4. Exemptions for religious or medical reasons are available.

\*Refer to the "Virginia Law" section in the *Virginia Homeschool Manual* for more details. Membership in Home School Legal Defense (HSLDA) is suggested.

## HOMESCHOOL STATUTE §22.1-254.1



Send the results of a test or evaluation to the division superintendent by Aug. 1 each year.

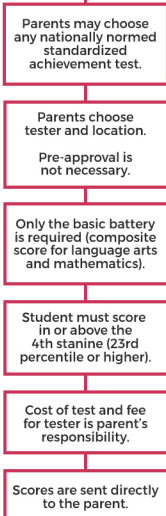
### \*DO NOT SUBMIT MORE INFORMATION THAN IS REQUIRED BY LAW.

When complying with the statute, HEAV encourages parents to use the least intrusive methods of compliance that are acceptable to your superintendent. The flow chart above describes several methods that have satisfied superintendents' requirements.

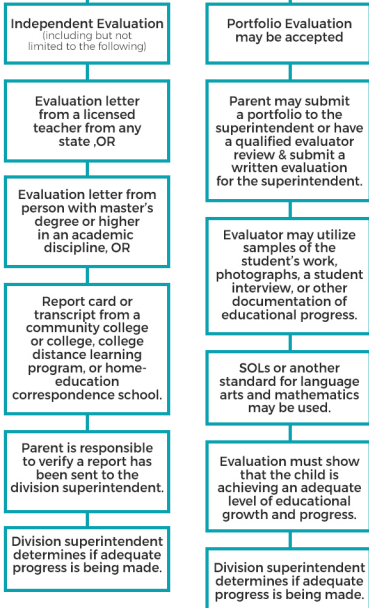
## TEST OR EVALUATION §22.1-254.1(C)\*



### Achievement Test



### Evaluation or Assessment



Submit test results, an evaluation, or portfolio to the division superintendent by August 1 each year. \*Testing requirements do not apply to children who are under the age of six as of Sept. 30 (§22.1-254.1(C))

If evidence of progress is not provided by the parent, the home instruction program for that child may be placed on probation for one year. Parents must file with the division superintendent evidence of their ability to provide an adequate education and a remediation plan for the probationary year indicating they will be addressing any educational deficiencies. Upon acceptance of the plan, home instruction may continue for one year. If the plan and evidence are not accepted or the evidence or progress is not provided by August 1 following the probationary year, home instruction shall cease. §22.1-254.1(C)
