

INTRODUCTION FOR TODAY'S READINGS

OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE

First Reading: Ezekiel 34: 11-12, 15-17 Ezekiel preached to Jewish exiles at Babylon in the sixth century before Christ. They were a disappointed people and they blamed poor leadership for getting them into this mess. In today's passage, Ezekiel uses a popular biblical image of God, that of a shepherd who cares for the sheep.

Second Reading: Corinthians 15: 20-26, 28 In his first letter to the Corinthians, Paul addresses problems his converts in the community were experiencing. Some members had questioned the bodily resurrection of Jesus and their own resurrection as well. Today's passage is Paul's response.

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTIONS

When the Son of Man comes in glory, may we be among those who feed the hungry, nourish the thirsty, welcome the stranger, clothe the naked, and visit and care for the ill and imprisoned. By sharing our gifts through the practice of good stewardship, Jesus tells us that we will receive God's blessing and inherit the eternal kingdom.

CHRISTMAS WAFER/BREAD "OPLATEK"

In Poland and in some other countries in central Europe, and among people of their ancestry, there is the custom of breaking and sharing a type of simple wafer at the Christmas meal. The Christmas wafer symbolizes the unity and love of family and friends. The exchange may also include a wish for long life, good health, joy and happiness at Christmas and during the New Year. Some people dip their piece of wafer in honey which symbolizes the sweet richness of God's blessings.

For families who would like to begin, continue or reestablish the tradition, decorative packets containing 5 fragile wafers are available at our church entrances the first weekend of Advent. December 2 and 3. The colored wafer is sometimes shared with pets since animals were also present at the birth of Jesus. The packet/envelop contains an explanation of the custom and prayer.
