

INTRODUCTION FOR TODAY'S READINGS THIRD SUNDAY IN LENT

First Reading: Exodus 20: 1-17 A covenant is a solemn agreement between two parties in which each promises something. The book of Exodus recounts how the Jews escaped from slavery in Egypt and made a covenant with God on Mount Sinai. The heart of that covenant is this: God promises to accept the Israelites as his people. On their part, they must promise to keep God's commandments.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 1:22-25 Paul wrote to his Corinthian converts about the difficulty in preaching about a crucified savior. To Jewish people who looked for a powerful Messiah performing spectacular signs, it seemed unacceptable that the Messiah would suffer and die. To Gentiles, it seemed entirely absurd that someone who died such a humiliating death could be the savior of the world.



THE BLESSING OF EASTER FOOD BASKETS



Easter Food Baskets will be blessed here at St. Michael Church on Holy Saturday at Noon.

People with Eastern European backgrounds - Poland, Russia, Serbia, Slovenia, Hungary, Ukraine, the Balkans and other countries with Slavic traditions - might be familiar with the blessing of Easter foods. What's in the baskets depends on the region one is from and the family's preferences. The food in the Easter baskets, like the food served during the Jewish Passover, would also carry significant religious symbolism.

- Bread-symbolizes Christ the Bread of Life. Easter bread is sometimes sweetened, braided, or even decorated with a dough cross.
- Butter-a symbol of God's goodness and the richness of salvation. Sometimes it is molded into the shape of a lamb. Cheese would have similar symbolism.
- Eggs-a symbol of life, hope, rebirth, and resurrection.
- Horseradish-symbolic of the bitterness and harshness of Christ's passion. It is sometimes mixed with grated beets.
- Meat-ham, lamb, smoked sausage-symbolize God's favor and generosity. Since pork was forbidden in the Old Testament, eating it now symbolizes that all things are made new in Christ. Linked sausage can remind us that Christ broke the chains of death and rose triumphant.
- Salt-to symbolize preservation and purification. It also reminds us the we are to be "the salt of the earth."
- Wine-to gladden the heart.
- Candy and baked sweets-symbolize God's providential sustenance, life's sweetness, eternal life, and the good things to come in the heavenly banquet.
- Candle-reminds us that Christ is our light. It may also be used at the Easter table.
- White cloth-used either under or over the food, symbolizes the burial cloth of Jesus that was found left in the tomb.



ST. JOSEPH'S TABLE



The Saint Joseph's Table is a tradition dating back to the Middle Ages when there was a severe drought in Sicily which resulted in a famine. The people prayed to God for rain, but they also prayed to St. Joseph to intercede with God on their behalf. They promised Saint Joseph that if God caused it to rain; they would hold a feast in Joseph's honor. The rains came, and the crops were planted. With the harvest, the people prepared the promised feast.

A Saint Joseph's Table of breakfast food will be available in the parish rectory following the 7:45 A.M. Mass on Monday, March 19th, St. Joseph's Feastday. The meal begins with the Litany of St. Joseph and a Blessing.

THE SHROUD OF TURIN: IS THIS THE FACE OF JESUS?
