

### LITURGICAL REFLECTION...

OF THE BODY AND CREMATED REMAINS

Following the most ancient Christian tradition, the Church insistently recommends that the PROPER BURIAL bodies of the deceased be buried in cemeteries or other sacred places. In memory of the death, burial and resurrection of the Lord, the mystery that illumines the Christian meaning of death, burial is above all the most fitting way to express faith and hope in the resurrection of the body. By burying the bodies of the faithful, the Church affirms her faith in the resurrection of the body, and intends to show the great dignity of our humanity which was assumed by Jesus our Lord.

# INTRODUCTION FOR TODAY'S READINGS Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Amos 7:12-15 Amos preached about 750 years before Christ and was the first prophet whose words were put into writing. At the time, the Jewish people were split into two kingdoms: Israel in the north and Judah in the south. Amos was not a prophet by occupation, but was sent by God to preach in the northern kingdom known as the shrine of Bethel. As so often happens to the prophets, the priest wasn't pleased that he came.

**Ephesians 1:3-14** Today and for the next few weeks, we will be reading consecutively from the letter to the Ephesians. Ephesus, a major seaport on the western coast of what is today Turkey, was a center for early Christians. Today's passage is the beginning of the letter and is a prayer praising God for the good things God has done for us.


