## What Is The Future of Ajax Downs?

Ajax Downs, located in Ajax, Ontario, a suburb east of Toronto, has a deep rooted history of horse racing in Canada

For 40 years, it has been exclusively devoted to the sport of Quarter Horse racing. Many of Canada's top jockeys have started their careers on the old "J-track". Formerly called "Picov Downs" the name was changed in 2006 with the establishment of a new Slots facility and construction of a full 6 furlong oval racetrack which was completed in 2009.

Mayor Steve Parish is calling a decision to close the slots operation in Ajax as "devious, backhanded and deceitful."

On Wednesday, a Peterborough newspaper reported provincial Agriculture, Food and Rural Affairs Minister Jeff Leal as saying three gaming sites, including Ajax, would have the slots removed.

A Town spokeswoman said officials have reached out to the Ontario Lottery Gaming (OLG) Corporation, but by late Wednesday had not heard back.

Parish said the Town was especially upset it found out about the developments through the media and not being told beforehand by the provincial government or Great Canadian Gaming, the B.C.-based company selected to operate gaming sites in the GTA

On Monday, Ajax council passed a motion calling for a third-party review of plans for

the slots

"Hiding the truth is the same thing as lying. I expected more from the government and more from our MPP (Joe Dickson)," Parish said.

"I've been in politics a long time and I've never seen anything so devious, backhanded and deceitful. It's unbelievable," he added. "In politics, I've seen devious, but this takes the cake."

The Town plans to fight to keep the casino, he said, adding it will be a major issue locally during the upcoming provincial election.

"It may be better to have an alternative government. This government is devious. We'll fight this all the way," Parish said

The Ajax facility is one of the most successful gaming sites in North America. We made repeated attempts to meet with both OLG and Great Canadian Gaming since the operator was selected. Now we know why we were ignored.

Ajax residents and the horse racing industry deserve more than a back room deal. The Town is now calling for an independent, fair, public review of the decision."
