

### Attempted Abduction in Whitby

Police are investigating an attempted abduction of an 8-year-old boy in north Whitby. On Thursday, February 15, 2018, at approximately 3:20 p.m., an 8-year-old boy was walking home near Watford Street and Downey Drive in Whitby. A small vehicle pulled up beside him and the driver said that the boy's father was involved in an accident. The boy immediately ran home and told his parents, who then called police.

The suspect is described as: male, white, mid-40s with short, spikey brown hair, green eyes and a grey goatee. He is possibly 6' tall. There is no clothing descriptors at this time. The suspect vehicle is described as: a black, four-door, newer vehicle with tinted windows and a sunroof. No plate was obtained. The vehicle was last seen driving on Downey Drive toward Carnwith Drive East.

### Air1 Follows Dangerous Driver and Locates Discarded Evidence

A 47-year-old male from Oshawa has been charged after he evaded police and travelled at speeds more than double the posted limit. On Saturday, January 27, 2018, at approximately 2:30 a.m., a female travelling in the area of Rossland Road West and Stevenson Road North in Oshawa called police because she was being followed by a male known to her.

He was driving erratically behind her and was trying to ram her vehicle. Communications/911 advised her to drive towards Central West Division in Whitby. Officers located the male's vehicle and, upon seeing officers, the male fled the area. He continued to evade police who backed off and for safety reasons. Eventually the male entered Highway 401 eastbound, travelling at speeds as high as 230 km/hr. Air1 followed the vehicle for 154 km, as officers on the road kept a safe distance away. The male travelled towards Peterborough, but then began to drive back towards Durham Region.

Officers from East Division strategically placed a tire deflation device on Ganaraska Road and were able to stop the vehicle. The driver fled on foot and officers searched the area. The male attempted to discard evidence in the forest but Air1 was able to direct ground units to the items. The suspect was found in a wooded area and arrested. A 47-year-old from Oshawa has been charged with Criminal Harassment; Possession of Cocaine; Possess Heroin for the Purpose of Trafficking; Possess Cocaine for the Purpose of Trafficking; Possess MDMA for the Purpose of Trafficking; Race a Motor Vehicle; Dangerous Operation of a Motor Vehicle and Driving While under Suspension. His name is being withheld due to the domestic nature of this incident. He was held for a bail hearing. It's believed to be the second longest police helicopter pursuit in Ontario history. ### Robbery in Ajax Two suspects are wanted after an armed robbery at a bank in Ajax.

On Monday, February 5, 2018, at approximately 11:45 a.m., two suspects, one armed with a handgun entered the Scotiabank located at Ravenscroft Road in Ajax. The suspects made a demand for cash and fled the scene. None of the store employees or customers were physically injured. K-9 officers along with uniform officers searched the immediate area with negative results. The suspects are described as:

Suspect #1 - male, white, wearing a mask to disguise his identity armed with a gun. Suspect #2 - male black, wearing a mask to disguise his identity armed with a knife.

### Single Snowmobile Collision in Port Perry

A 45-year-old Whitby female was seriously injured after a single snowmobile collision in Port Perry. On Sunday, February 4, 2018 at approximately 7:15 p.m., members from North Division responded to reports of a collision involving a snowmobile in the area of Reach Street and Old Simcoe Street in Port Perry. The snowmobile was travelling southbound on Old Simcoe Street when the driver lost control as she crossed Reach Street. The female driver was ejected and suffered serious injuries. She was transported to a local hospital and then taken to a Toronto area trauma center with serious but non-life threatening injuries. Members of the DRPS Traffic Services Branch, Collision Investigation Unit, attended

the scene to conduct an investigation. The area of the roadway was closed for several hours while evidence was collected.

### Traffic Stop Results in Numerous Charges

A routine traffic stop for a traffic violation resulted in the seizure of drugs and two suspects facing numerous charges.

On Friday, February 2, 2018, at approximately 9:45 p.m., a member of Central West Division observed a vehicle in the area of Manning Road and Garrard Road in Whitby which failed to stop for a stop sign. The suspect vehicle almost struck the fully marked police vehicle. The vehicle was stopped and further investigation revealed a quantity of drugs and two replica firearms within.

Shawn EMERSON, age 40 and Jacqueline DAVIS, age 20, both of Harwood Avenue in Ajax have been charged with: Possession of Cannabis for the Purpose of Trafficking; Possession of Hashish for the Purpose of Trafficking; Possession of Crystal Methamphetamine for the Purpose of Trafficking; Possession of Percocets for the Purpose of Trafficking and Possession of LSD for the Purpose of Trafficking. EMERSON faces an additional Highway Traffic Act charge of Disobey Sign - Fail to Stop.

### Used Car Sales Manager Charged with Fraud

A former sales manager at an Oshawa used car dealership has been charged with fraud after more than \$140,000 went missing from the company, its owner and several banking institutions. On Thursday, January 25, 2018, investigators with the DRPS Fraud Unit arrested the 39-year-old Oshawa male in connection with an investigation that focused on his time as a sales manager at Countryside Motors on Simcoe Street South in Oshawa. He was employed as a sales manager at that company and allegedly committed frauds between September 2014 and May 2016. The frauds included obtaining financing using a forged application, obtaining unauthorized and forged company cheques, re-directing e-Transfers from the company's accounts to his personal accounts and the unauthor-

ized use of the company credit cards.

Ryen MAXWELL, age 39, of Oshawa has been charged with: Fraud Over \$5000 x7; Fraud Under \$5000; Possession of Property Obtained by Crime Over \$5000 x4; Possession of Property Obtained by Crime Under \$5000; Forgery x3; Utter Forged Document x2; and Unauthorized Use of Credit Card Data x2.

### DRPS Officers Credited with Saving Lives

Four DRPS officers in Oshawa are being credited with saving the lives of two men found unconscious in an abandoned vehicle.

On Thursday, January 25, 2018, just after 8 p.m., two frontline officers from Central East Division on routine patrol decided to check out reports of drug activity in the area of Albert Street and Phillips Street.

They located two unconscious males, both in their late 20s, inside an abandoned landscaping truck. The men were not dressed appropriately for the cold conditions and the windows in the truck had been smashed out. There was a small fire smoldering under one of the males. Fire and EMS were called to the scene.

Two additional police officers arrived and they were able to remove one of the males from the vehicle to an awaiting ambulance. Naloxone was administered and the male was revived. The jaws of life were required to remove the second male and, after about 20 minutes, he also responded positively to Naloxone. Both males were taken to hospital and are expected to survive.

Information was received about a third male who had consumed the same drugs but was no longer at the scene. Officers searched the area and later located the male at a shelter and he was in good health.

### Fraud Suspect Arrested After Crime Spree at Local Fitness Clubs

A 33-year-old Toronto woman is facing over 50 charges for defrauding multiple victims at Goodlife Fitness locations in Durham Region and across the GTA.

On Wednesday January 24, 2018, officers arrested a female at the Goodlife location on Consumers Road in

Whitby, after a month-long investigation by our Major Crime Fraud Unit.

It's believed the accused attended Goodlife locations across the GTA, including five locations in Durham, where she posed as a gym member and entered the women's locker room. Once inside, lockers were broken into and victims' property stolen, including identification, credit cards and bank cards. The accused used the stolen items to make fraudulent purchases and cash withdrawals. Falyn CLAYTON, age 33, of Weston Road in Toronto, faces over 50 fraud-related charges including: Possess Break-in Instrument; Theft Under \$5,000; Mischief Under \$5,000; Possession of Credit Card Obtained by Crime and Possession of Identity Document of Another. CLAYTON was held for a Bail Hearing.

Investigators have identified approximately 20 victims and are asking anyone who may have been victimized to come forward.

### Male Charged with Assaulting a Police Officer

An 18-year-old male is facing charges after he assaulted a police officer who was responding to his call for assistance.

On Friday, February 9, 2018, at approximately 3:35 a.m., DRPS officers responded to a residence on Cabot Street in Oshawa after a male called looking for assistance in removing an unwanted female from his home. The male stated he asked the female to leave but she refused. When police arrived, the male, who was under the influence of alcohol, became combative with one of the responding officers and made threats. In order to subdue the male, one of the officers used a conducted energy weapon. He was then placed under arrest. Jacob VILLENEUVE, age 18 of Cabot Street in Oshawa, is charged with Assault Police Officer and Uttering Threats to Cause Death or Bodily Harm x2. He was released on a Promise to Appear.
