#### **Durham Region continues to eliminate accessibility barriers**

Whitby, Ontario - On Wednesday, Durham Regional Council passed The Regional Municipality of Durham's Accessibility Advisory Committee's (AAC) 2017 Annual Report. This document outlines initiatives completed throughout the previous calendar year, contributing to eliminate accessibility barriers across Regional operations.

The Region of Durham first implemented an Accessibility Plan in 2003, and since that time, the AAC have been working to achieve a more accessible environment through identifying, removing and preventing barriers related to attitudes; information and communication; policies and procedures; customer service; employment; programs and services; transportation; and the design of public spaces. Initiatives completed throughout 2017 include:

- An Annual Joint Forum was held in September 2017. The Region's AAC presented Accessibility Awards that acknowledged persons, businesses and/or organizations that have made considerable efforts to incorporate accessibility into their operations.
- Input on Durham Region Transit operations.
- The AAC hosted several informative accessibility focused presentations to learn more about industry trends, initiatives and technology.
- Accessibility articles to broaden community awareness of accessibility.
- National Access Awareness Week (May 28 to June 3), which included activities and presentations.

"The Region of Durham strives to achieve a fully inclusive and accessible environment—one that understands different types of disabilities and the barriers that prevent full participation," said Roger Anderson, Regional Chair and Chief Executive Officer. "The expertise, experience and dedication of the AAC is of great value to the Region's accessibility work, ensuring a safe and fully inclusive community for our residents."

Ontario's accessibility laws require the Region of Durham to have an Accessibility Advisory Committee to advise Durham Regional Council about the preparation of accessibility plans and the achievement of actions outlined within the plan. The Region's AAC was first established in 2002, and consists of members from various backgrounds, several local area municipalities, with different types of disabilities.
