March 5 - Kodiak Cakes Issues Allergy Alert on Undeclared Milk in Kodiak Cakes Blueberry Chia Energy Waffles 10.72 oz. Product UPC code is 7 05599 01215 0.

Kodiak Cakes of Park City, UT is recalling all lots and codes of Kodiak Cakes Blueberry Chia Energy Waffles 10.72 oz that were on shelf prior to March 5, 2018 because they contain undeclared milk. People who have an allergy or severe sensitivity to milk run the risk of serious or life-threatening allergic reaction if they consume these products.

March 5 - IDLife, LLC Issues Allergy Alert on Various Undeclared Allergens in its Bars

IDLife, LLC of Frisco, TX is voluntarily recalling its line of Protein Bars (Lot #s PR33471, PR31771, & PR31971), Snack Bars (Lot #s SN32071 & SN30771), and Kids Bars (Lot #s A3617-1 & 03047-1), because they may contain undeclared allergens. As part of its quality control review process, IDLife discovered that the lots of Protein Bars referenced above may contain undisclosed almonds, the lots of Snack Bars referenced above may contain undisclosed peanuts, and the lots of Kids Bars may contain undisclosed almonds and coconut oil. People who have an allergy or severe sensitivity to these specific allergens run the risk of serious or life-threatening allergic reaction if they consume these products.

March 6 - Redbarn Pet Products Expands Voluntary Recall of Dog Chews

Redbarn Pet Products, LLC of Long Beach, CA is expanding their voluntarily recall initially issued on February 9th. The recall expanded to include all lots of product manufactured with raw material from a single supplier because it has the potential to be contaminated with Salmonella. The recall is limited to products distributed March 2017 through February 2018. This supplier's raw material was used to produce the Redbarn, Chewy Louie, Dentley's and Good Lovin' brand products listed below with best-buy dates ending in BC. In total, 24 SKUs are affected. Salmonella can affect animals eating the products, and there is a risk to humans from handling contaminated pet products, especially if they have not thoroughly washed their hands after having contact with the products or any surfaces exposed to these products.

March 1 - Double Insight Recalls Multicookers Due to Fire Hazard; Sold Exclusively at Walmart - The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission, in cooperation with Double Insight Inc., of Canada, today announced a voluntary recall of Gem 65 8-in-1 multicookers. A manufacturer defect can cause the multicooker to overheat and melt on the underside, posing a fire hazard.

March 1 - Graco Recalls Highchairs Due to Fall Hazard; Sold Exclusively at Walmart

The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission, in cooperation with Graco Children's Products Inc., of Atlanta, Ga., today announced a voluntary recall of Graco Table2Table 6-in-1 Highchairs. The highchair's rear legs can pivot out of position making the chair unstable and posing a fall hazard to a child in the highchair.

March 1 - Goodman Company Recalls Packaged Terminal Air Conditioners and Heat Pumps Due to Burn and Fire Hazards - The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission, in cooperation with Goodman Company, L.P. of Houston, Texas, today announced a voluntary recall of Packaged Terminal Air Conditioners/Heat Pumps (PTACs). The outdoor fan motors can overheat, posing burn and fire hazards.

March 5 - Goodman Manufacturing Recalls Modular Blowers Due to Fire Hazard

The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission, in cooperation with Goodman Manufacturing Company, L.P., of Houston, Texas, today announced a voluntary recall of Modular blowers. The labels found on the serial plate have incorrect electrical information that could result in installers and servicers using undersized wiring or incorrect fuse/circuit breaker parts, posing a fire hazard.

March 6 - Woodstream Recalls Mosquito Magnet Traps Due to Injury Hazard

The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission, in cooperation with Woodstream Corporation, of Knoxville, Tenn., today announced a voluntary recall of Mosquito Magnet traps. The recalled mosquito traps can become damaged if cleaning it while powered on with the company's Quick Clear Cartridge kits and can propel broken pieces of the regulator, posing an injury hazard to consumers.

March 6 - InSinkErator Recalls SinkTop Switch Accessory for Garbage Disposals Due to Fire Hazard - The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission, in cooperation with InSinkErator of Racine, Wis., today announced a voluntary recall of InSinkErator Single Outlet SinkTop Switches. Water can get into the power module, posing a fire hazard.

March 7 - Topson Downs Recalls Cat & Jack Girls' Star Studded Jeans Due to Laceration Hazard; Sold Exclusively at Target - The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission, in cooperation with Topson Downs, of Culver City, Calif., today announced a voluntary recall of Cat & Jack Girls' Star Studded Skinny Jeans. The metal stars can detach, posing a laceration hazard.

March 7 - First Aid Research Recalls Maximum Strength Bacitraycin Plus Ointment With Lidocaine Due to Failure to Meet Child Resistant Closure Requirement

The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission, in cooperation with First Aid Research Corp., of Jupiter, Fla., today announced a voluntary recall of Maximum Strength Bacitraycin Plus Ointment with Lidocaine. The packaging is not child resistant as required by the Poison Prevention Packaging Act. The pain relieving ointment contains lidocaine, posing a risk of poisoning to young children if they put it on their skin or ingest it.

The front brake master cylinder piston can crack, resulting in brake failure, posing a crash hazard to the rider.

March 13 - MAAX Spas Recalls Hot Tubs and Swim Spas Due to Fire Hazard
