## Ontario Added 15,700 Jobs in February

Jobs Since This Time Last Year

Employment in Ontario increased by 15,700 jobs in February and the unemployrate ment remained unchanged at 5.5 per cent.

According to the recently released 2017-18 Third Quarter Finances, the government is projecting to deliver on its commitment to balance the budget this year while making investments in the programs and services people and families rely on most.

Ontario's economy has shown steady growth. In fact, since 2014 Ontario's economy has grown more than Canada's and all of the other G7 countries, but the government knows that more must be done to ensure that the benefits of a growing economy are shared fairly across the province.

Ontario is committed to modernizing employment standards and labour laws while

This includes raising the minimum wage to \$14 an hour on January 1, ensuring part-time workers are paid the same hourly wage as full-time workers, introducing paid sick days for every worker, and enabling at least three weeks' vacation after five years with the same employer.

> Ontario's plan to create fairness and opportunity during this period of rapid economic change includes a higher minimum wage and better working conditions, free tuition for hundreds of thousands of students, easier access to affordable child care, and free prescription drugs for everyone under 25 through the biggest expansion of medicare in a generation.

#### QUICK FACTS

Employment growth has occurred in many economic regions across the province, year-over-year increases include Stratford-Bruce Peninsula (4.3 per cent), Toronto (4.0 per cent) and Hamilton-Niagara Peninsula

The employment increase was led by monthly gains in the transportation and warehousing and educational services sectors.

Private-sector forecasters, on average, have estimated that Ontario real GDP increased by 2.8 per cent in 2017.

Ontario's Business Growth Initiative is a five-year commitment of more than \$650 million to grow the economy and create jobs by promoting an innovation-based economy, helping small companies scale-up and modernizing regulations for businesses.

### Inattentive Driving Deadliest **Behaviour on OPP-patrolled Roads** for Fifth Consecutive Year

**OPP** Conducts Distracted Driving Campaign (March 12 – 18, 2018)

Over March Break, the Ontario Provincial Police will be highly focused on what has been the deadliest kind of driver on OPPpatrolled roads for the fifth consecutive year - the inattentive driver.

Inattentive drivers were behind 83 road fatalities on OPPpatrolled roads in 2017, surpassing speed-related deaths (75), alcohol/drug-related deaths (46) and those that are linked to lack of seat belt use (49).

Since 2009 (the year Ontario Distracted Driving laws took effect), 692 have been killed on OPP-patrolled roads in collisions that involved an inattentive driver.

"By now, the majority of drivers and passengers have witnessed, had a close call or been involved in a collision with a driver who was texting, talking on their cell phone or engaged in some other form of distraction. Last year, the OPP responded to 8,711 crashes that were linked to driver inattention. These drivers have no regard for your safety, making it as important as ever that you lead by example on the road and be a strong voice in your community and on social media about this deadly driving behaviour." - OPP Deputy Commissioner Brad Blair, Provincial Commander of Traffic Safety and Operational Support.
