Business Spotlight

On Sunday August 5, 2018 the 8th Annual Tony Ruszkowski/Never Alone Golf Event will be held at Mountaineer's Woodview Golf Course. Thanks to your generous support we have been able to grow from a small event to an event that draws well over 120 golfers each year. With business and community support, we have been able to give 33 students scholarships totaling over \$39,000. We have also been able to donate over \$25,000 to Children's Hospital in Pittsburgh

The tournament is held in memory of 22 year old Tony Ruszkowski. He was killed in an automobile accident on July 3, 2011. Tony left behind loving parents, a sister, and most importantly a fiancée with a baby on the way. He had recently begun working at a gas station and was looking forward to learning the gender of their baby.

However, Tony struggled with substance abuse. A struggle that ended his life. Tragically, he made several attempts to get treatment for his addiction only to find out there were no spots available, waiting lists of 6 months or longer, or up front payments for as much as \$20,000. Americans are in need of treatment for addiction. Over 100,000 of them die each year making it the third leading cause of preventable death in the United States. Tony's family and friends find these statistics and barriers to treatment

Our scholarships are used to help students whose lives have been affected by addiction. It may be either their own or that of someone in their lives. The first 2 scholarships that we provided went to Tony's fiancée so that she would be better prepared to take care of her children, and the second went to a young man whose mother passed away after years of addiction. He is graduating this year with a 3.9 grade average in bio-chemistry. Our scholarship is presented annually to one student from Weir High, one from Madonna, one from Brooke, and one from Oak Glen. We also select one at large scholarship based on need.

West Liberty University is offering its Bachelor of Arts in Leadership and Administration (BLA) on site at West Virginia Northern Community College (WVNCC), Weirton.

Classes begin: August 23, 2018 (Thursday evening meetings, 6pm)

'This successful program has been offered in Weirton since 2012 and we are pleased to announce the start of a new group. It is tailored for adult students who want to finish their bachelor's degree to become a better leader or supervisor, gain employment

or get promoted," said Dr. Thomas Michaud, Dean of WLU's School of Professional Studies.

At a time when the cost of higher education is under constant scrutiny, Michaud believes that the BLA is a perfect choice for many adults.

"Our BLA is very popular with working adult students and we are grateful to West Virginia Northern for helping us reach those who want to enroll right here in Weirton. We are also grateful to the Weirton Chamber of Commerce for helping us promote this program," Michaud added.

Larry Tackett, WVNCC Vice President for Economic and Workforce Development, says that, "Our students will find that the BLA degree is both economical and empowering. It is a boost to careers and makes a degree attainable. We are pleased to have the BLA and its professors on our Weirton campus."

Students must be at least 23 years old with more than 60 credit hours to enroll. Qualified students are also able to receive substantial credit for work experience.

The 36-credit hour BLA program can be completed within 17 months. Its affordable tuition is one rate for all students, regardless if they live in WV, OH or PA, and financial aid is available for those who qualify.
