GROW OP FOUND IN AJAX

people are facing charges after a marihuana grow operation was located at a residence in Ajax.

The West Division Target Team received information about a possible grow op at a home on Purcell Lane. An investigation was initiated.

On Friday, May 11, 2018, a CDSA search warrant was executed at the residence. A total of 13 marihuana plants, a quantity of marihuana seeds and equipment for growing the plants was seized during the search. The street value of the marihuana seized is estimated at \$13,000.

Tania WILLIAMS, age 42, and Paris WILLIAMS, age 19, both of Purcell Lane in Ajax, are charged with: Production of Schedule II Substance (marihuana).

Suspect Arrested Following Pharmacy Robbery in Whitby

olice arrested one male afte a pharmacy was robbed and one person confined for two hours.

On Friday May 11, 2018, at approximately 10:15 a.m., a male entered a pharmacy on **Dundas Street West in Whitby** and produced a knife. He demanded an employee open the narcotics safe and lock the doors to the pharmacy. The employee was confined in the building for about two hours while the male ingested

a quantity of drugs in an effort to harm himself.

The male then left the pharmacy and police were contacted. The male was located a short time later at a residence and arrested without incident. He was taken to hospital where was treated and released. The employee was not physically harmed.

A 43-year-old male is charged with Robbery; Forcible Confinement and Weapons Dangerous.

Suspect Wanted after Cellphone Store Robbery in Pickering

Police are looking to identify a suspect following a robbery at a Pickering cellphone store last Friday.

On Friday May 11, 2018, at approximately 11:00 a.m., police responded to Freedom Mobile at Kingston Road and Valley Farm in Pickering regarding a robbery call. The clerk indicated an unknown male entered the store asking to purchase a phone. The clerk produced the phone and the suspect pushed and grabbed the clerk before fleeing the store with the phone. The clerk was not physically injured.

The suspect is described as: male, black, about 25-35 years old and 6'4" tall. He was wearing a black-hooded shirt and black and white baseball

Male Charged Following Incident at the Oshawa Airport

A 35-year-old male is facing several charges after entering the Oshawa Airport, boarding an aircraft near the runway, and causing damage to a washroom in the building.

On Saturday May 12, 2018, at approximately 8:15 p.m., police were called to the Oshawa Airport on Airport Boulevard. Reports indicated a male was in the women's washroom and had caused significant damage to pipes and wiring. Prior to this, the suspect had entered an unauthorized area near the runway and jumped into an aircraft that was taxiing for take-off.

Police arrested one male and he faces several charges. No one was physically harmed during the incident.

Chad HOBBS, age 35, of Simcoe Street South in Oshawa is charged with: Mischief Damage to Property Under \$5,000; Damaging or Interfering Air Navigational Facility; Interfere Duties of Crew Member and Enter Premises When Entry Prohibited.

Shot Fired into a Residence

Officers are investigating after a shot was fired into an Oshawa residence.

On Sunday, May 13, 2018, at approximately 4:14 a.m., officers responded to residence in the Rossland Road East and Wilson Road North area.

The residents were awoken by the sound of a gunshot. A window had been shot and a bullet was lodged into the wall on the main floor of the home. A bullet casing was found out-

Police are continuing to investigate but do not believe this is a random incident. However, the residents of this home just moved in and are not believed to be the intended target of this incident.

Suspects Sought Following Armed Home Invasion

Police are looking for suspects after a home invasion in Oshawa early this morning.

On Wednesday May 9, 2018, just after midnight, police were called to a residence in the Wilson and Taunton area of Oshawa.

The complainant reported four males came to the home and forced their way in. It's believed they were armed with firearms. A brief altercation took place inside the home and the suspects fled empty handed. The home owner was not physically harmed. Investigators believe this is not a random act.

All four male suspects had their faces covered and were wearing dark clothing. It's believed they fled in a silver or dark grey mini-van.

Traffic Stop in Whitby Leads to Drug Charges

A Whitby male is facing drug charges after a routine traffic stop early this morning led to the seizure of over \$30,000 in cash and drugs.

On Wednesday May 9, 2018, just after 2:00 a.m., officers from Central West Division stopped a vehicle travelling westbound on Taunton Road near Garrard Road for a headlight infraction.

Officers detected a strong odour of marihuana and the vehicle was searched. A quantity of marihuana and cocaine were located along with cash and drug paraphernalia. The male was arrested and charged. The street value of the drugs and cash seized is over \$30,000.

Mehmet ASKAR, age 22, of Rolling Acres Drive in Whitby, is charged with Possession for the Purpose of Trafficking (cannabis); Possession for the Purpose of Trafficking (cocaine); Possession for the Purpose of Trafficking (resin) and Proceeds of Crime over \$5.000.

Male Suspect Wanted for Indecent Act

Police are attempting to identify a male suspect who was seen naked and masturbating near a Clarington creek on Saturday.

On Saturday, May 5, 2018, at approximately 3:50 p.m., a female was fishing in a creek near Tooley's Mill Park in the Centerfield Drive and Highway 2 area with her child when she saw a naked male masturbating about 50 meters away from their location. A few moments later he left the creek area heading north on foot and the female called police.

Responding officers did not locate the male; however, they did speak to community members in the area to alert them of the incident.

The suspect is described as: male, white, 20 to 35 years old, slim build with muscle tone, reddish brown hair that was shaved on the sides and longer on the top.

Male Driver Tries to Hit Pedestrians in Parking Lot

A 21-year-old male is facing charges after he attempted to hit pedestrians with his vehicle in a Pickering parking lot. On Friday, May 4, 2018, at approximately 11:18 p.m., police were called to the Boston Pizza on Brock Road after a driver was seen trying to intentionally hit pedestrians. When officers arrived, the male was seen fleeing through the parking lot on foot. An officer chased him down and placed him under arrest.
