TRENT-SEVERN WATERWAY OPENS FOR 2018 NAVIGATION SEASON

ETERBOROUGH, ONTARIO, May 18., 2018 – Parks Canada announces that the Trent-Severn Waterway's 44 lock stations located between Trenton and Port Severn are now open for the 2018 navigation season. Last year, the Trent-Severn Waterway saw

an increase in boat traffic of 30% over 2016 and we look forward to continue to welcome visitors this season.

2018 the perfect time to experience the rich heritage and natural beauty of this Canadian National Historic

Site and we continue to improve our visitor offering by developing new and innovative programs, improved facilities and expanded services.

NEW this year! Paddlers get a 50% discount on seasonal lockage permits for canoes and kayaks. We invite all paddlers to launch their own adventure along Canada's original highways. The lockage permit is valid for the entire navigation season and

provides passage through all of Parks Canada's historic canals.

This season, visitors to the waterway can also take advantage of two free lockage days. On June 24th free lockage will be provided as a "thank you" for a great 2017 Season and on July 1st free lockage will be provided in celebration of Canada Day.

Also new for the 2018 naviga-

tion season is the recently launched Ontario Waterways Water Management InfoNet, accessible on the Trent-Severn Waterway website home page. The portal contains background information on water management practices, water management updates, frequently asked questions about water management, various reports on water management, and the most recent water levels of lakes along the waterway.

Six questions on the 407 ETR data theft scandal

Ontarians have the right to know the facts regarding the theft of personal information of 60,000 people who travel on Highway 407.

Late Wednesday, it was revealed that personal data has been stolen from 407 ETR freeway in what has been described as an "internal theft." Following the allegations, Simmer Sandhu, a litigation analyst in the collections department at the 407 resigned suddenly as Ford's candidate for Brampton East.

People are asking: Are Doug Ford's Conservatives using stolen data for political gain? It's a question Ford needs to answer. The NDP wants answers to the following questions:

1. Does the Ford campaign have illegally obtained information from the 407 ETR?
 2. Who has been able to access the data?
 3. How was this data used? Was this data used to recruit party members? Was it used for fundraising? Was it used to contact voters? Did this information affect the outcome of nomination meetings? Is this data being used in any way in Ford's election campaign?
 4. Are all those potentially involved, including Ford and members of his party, cooperating with police?
 5. Have Elections Ontario, the privacy commissioner and the police been notified by Ford's Party?
 6. If personal data is in the hands of Ford and the Conservative party, how can Ontarians be sure that it will be destroyed and not kept?
- Ontarians should be able to drive Highway 407 without fear of having their privacy violated. With much more to come on this troubling story, Ontarians are looking for answers.
