Two Pedestrian Struck by Vehicle in Oshawa

A 28-year-old male and a 27-year-old female both residents of Oshawa were struck by a vehicle. On Saturday, June 9, 2018 approximately 12:49 a.m., members of Central East Division were called to serious motor vehicle collision involving a vehicle and two pedestrians. A black Honda Civic was southbound on Ritson Road South, at the intersection of Dean Avenue when it struck two pedestrians walking across the roadway. Several individuals stopped to render assistance to the injured pedestrians. The 72-year-old driver of the involved Honda remained on scene and also rendered assistance. The driver sustained a minor injury as a result of the collision. E.M.S. attended the scene and provided medical assistance to the 28-year-old male pedestrian. The male pedestrian was transported to a Toronto area trauma center where he is currently listed in stable condition. The 27-year-old female suffered only minor injuries. Members of the DRPS Traffic Services Branch, Collision Investigation Unit, attended the scene to conduct an

investigation. The area of the roadway was closed for several hours while evidence was collected.

Suspect Wanted After an Indecent Act in Whitby

Police are looking to identify a male who exposed himself to a female in Whitby. On Friday, May 25, 2018, at approximately 9:25 p.m., members of Central West Division responded to an indecent act in the area of Garrard Road and Hartrick Place in Whitby. The victim was walking on the sidewalk when the suspect passed her and was committing an indecent act. The victim ran home and contacted police. Police searched the area with negative results. The suspect is described as male, with a tanned complexion, 23-24 years old, approximately 5'6" to 5'7" tall, thin build, curly dark hair in 5' to 6' curls. He was wearing a white v-neck shirt, medium wash denim jeans, Nike shoes and had headphones on. Anyone with information about this incident is asked to contact D/Cst. Male Charged after Fleeing From Police on Motorcycle

A 27-year-old Oshawa male is facing numerous charges after he struck an officer while attempting to flee from police. On Wednesday, June 6, 2018, at approximately 5:00 p.m., a member of Central West Division observed a black motorcycle at Simcoe Street and Niagara Drive in Oshawa. This motorcycle and driver were wanted from an incident on May 27, 2018 where the suspect was driving in a dangerous manner, almost striking a pedestrian. As officers attempted to follow the motorcycle, it was seen driving into oncoming traffic and driving at a high rate of speed. Officers followed the motorcycle and when they attempted to pull over the driver, the motorcycle accelerated and drove towards the officer striking the police vehicle and the officer. The suspect then drove on the sidewalk to avoid police. The suspect lost control of the motorcycle and officers attempted to arrest him. The suspect began punching the officer and was eventually taken into custody after officers used a Conducted Energy Weapon. Several officers received minor injuries during this incident.

Evan DART, age 27 of Renaissance Drive in Oshawa, is charged with: Dangerous Operation of a Motor Vehicle; Flight from Police; Assault a Police Officer; Assault with Intent to Resist; Assault a Police Officer with a Weapon and numerous violations under the Highway Traffic Act. He was released on a Promise to Appear.

Suspect Flees in Vehicle, Damages Cruisers

A suspect in a theft investigation fled police in a vehicle and refused to stop after being boxed in by responding cruisers. On Monday, May 28, 2018 at approximately 10:24 p.m., officers were called to a theft in progress at the Real Canadian Superstore on Taunton Road West in Whitby. A loss prevention officer in the store observed three males filling shopping carts with products and leaving without paying. Officers arrived and arrested one male nearby, but the two other suspects ran away. One suspect was seen getting into a burgundy cargo van and driving away; the other fleeing suspect was arrested nearby. Responding officers located the vehicle driving erratically eastbound on Rossland Road in Oshawa. Several cruisers attempted to stop the vehicle, but it rammed the cruisers and kept going. At one point, the vehicle drove over a residential driveway and struck two parked vehicles while

fleeing. Eventually, the vehicle was boxed in on Rossland near Hortop Street. The driver continued to ram the cruisers in an effort to break free and a Conducted Energy Weapon was deployed to subdue him and prevent further damage. Based on his behaviour, the 46-year-old driver, from Pickering, was taken to hospital for an assessment and was formed under the Mental Health Act. He is facing numerous charges. The other two suspects are also facing charges.

Abbas KHALEGHIPOUR, age 56, of Toronto is charged with Theft Under \$5,000; Possession of Stolen Property; Fail to Comply with Recognizance x2, Fail to Comply With Probation Order x2; and Possession of a Schedule I substance (cocaine). Andrew FRIEL, age 43, of Toronto is charged with Theft Under \$5,000 and Possession of Stolen Property Under \$5,000.
