Male Critically Injured in ATV Collision

A 50-year-old male sustained life-threatening injuries after an ATV collision in Scugog. On Monday, July 30, 2018 at approximately 12:47 p.m., members of North Division were dispatched to a serious motor vehicle collision involving an ATV at a private residence on Scugog Line 12 in the Township of Scugog. The driver of the ATV was heading back to his residence in his private lane way, northbound, when the ATV lost control and entered the ditch. The ATV struck a tree and the driver was thrown off. The driver was transported to a local hospital with head injuries and later flown by air ambulance to a Trauma Centre in Toronto where he remains in critical condition. The driver was not wearing a helmet at the time of the collision. Police do not suspect alcohol or drugs were a factor. Members of the DRPS Traffic Services Branch, Collision Investigation Unit, attended the scene to conduct an investigation.

Two Officers and Citizens Assisted Occupants of a Rollover in Brock Township

Two officers and several citizens came to the aid of three occupants after finding a vehicle submerged in water in Brock Township overnight. On Sunday, July 29, 2018 at approximately 9:13 p.m., two officers from Central East Division were driving back to the region when they heard a call for a serious collision in the area of Regional Road 13 and Highway 12 in Brock Township. The officers found a Dodge Journey on its roof submerged in water. The officers, with the assistance of several citizens, were able to smash the glass and extract a 7-year old boy and his 12-year-old sister who were trapped inside. They were able to breathe from an air bubble in the vehicle. EMS assisted and took the occupants to local hospital. The female driver was able to get out of the vehicle prior to police arrival. The vehicle was originally westbound on Regional Road 13 when it lost control, striking a hydro pole and flipping onto its roof. The vehicle ended up in swampy water by the side of the road. The 30-year-old female driver of the vehicle was charged with Dangerous Operation of a Motor Vehicle x2 and Fail to

bubble in the vehicle. EMS assisted and took the occupants to local hospital. The female driver was able to get out of the vehicle prior to police arrival. The vehicle was originally westbound on Regional Road 13 when it lost control, striking a hydro pole and flipping onto its roof. The vehicle ended up in swampy water by the side of the road. The 40-year-old female driver of the vehicle was charged with Dangerous Operation of a Motor Vehicle x2 and Fail to Provide Breath Sample x2. She was released on a Promise to Appear. Her name is being withheld to protect the identity of the children.

Nine Vehicles Stolen in Four Days in Pickering & Ajax

Police are asking residents to be vigilant after nine vehicles were stolen in four days from various residential driveways and businesses in Pickering and Ajax. Investigators say from Tuesday, July 24 to Friday, July 27, 2018, they have had reports of nine vehicles of several makes and models stolen. In the majority of cases, the keys were left in the ignition or the vehicle was left running and unattended when it was stolen during the evening and overnight hours. Residents are reminded to lock vehicles and remove any valuables from view, or better yet remove them from the vehicle. It's also important not to let your vehicle idle unattended and unlocked in the driveway or on the road. This will make it more difficult for someone to hop in and steal your vehicle.

Suspect Wanted after Street-Level Robbery in Bowmanville

Police are looking for two suspects following a street-level robbery in Bowmanville Tuesday. On Tuesday, July 24, 2018, at

approximately 4:15 p.m., police were called to a foot path in the area of Spry Avenue and Baseline Road. The 20-year-old male victim reported two males approached him said they had a knife. The victim was punched and the suspects fled with some jewelry after nearby witnesses approached the scene. The victim was not seriously hurt and no weapon was seen. Suspect #1 is described as: male, black, in his early 20s, about 5'8" tall, 140 lbs., wearing dark jeans and a blue shirt.

Suspect #2 is described as: male, black, in his early 20s, about 5'8" tall, 140 lbs., wearing beige pants and a white shirt. Witnesses report the suspects were seen fleeing north on Lawrence toward Hwy 2 in a silver Honda or Hyundai vehicle.

Stabbing Victim in Ajax

A 20-year-old Ajax man is recovering in a Toronto trauma centre after suffering a stab wound in Ajax. On Thursday, July 26, 2018 at approximately 2:45 a.m. officers were called to a coffee shop on Harwood Avenue South in Ajax regarding an injured male. Officers discovered a male suffering from a stab wound and he was rushed to a nearby hospital. The 20-year-old male victim said he was sleeping in a forested area near Mackenzie Street off of Bayly Street when he was attacked by two white males and a black female at approximately 2:20 a.m. He made his way to the coffee shop but waited 20 minutes before calling emergency services.

Male Shot After Argument on an Oshawa Street

A 46-year-old Oshawa man is recovering from injuries after being shot on an Oshawa street after a brief argument. On Thursday, July 26, 2018 at approximately 2 a.m. officers were called to Lakeridge Health – Oshawa regarding a patient with a non-life threatening gunshot wound. The investigation revealed that while visiting a friend at a

rooming house near the intersection of Bloor Street and Albert Street in Oshawa, he became engaged in an argument with another male in a vehicle parked outside. The unknown male pulled out a gun and the victim began to run away, but was struck by a single bullet. He then made his way to hospital for treatment. The suspect is described as a male, black, early 20s, with braids in his hair that stuck out and tattoos on his arms. He was in a silver BMW sedan with a black female.

Two Suspects Wanted after Grocery Store Robbed in Ajax

Investigators have released surveillance images and updated suspect descriptions in hopes of identifying the two suspects wanted in connection with an armed robbery in Ajax. Suspect #1 is described as male, black, in his 20s, wearing a handkerchief or scarf over his face, with a black toque, a grey sweatshirt and grey jogging pants. He was holding a black handgun. Suspect #2 is described as male, black, in his 20s, wearing a handkerchief or scarf over his face, with a black toque, a black sweatshirt and black jogging pants. He was carrying a black bag. At approximately 11:15 p.m. on Thursday, March 15, 2018, members of West Division responded to a commercial robbery at Sal's Grocery Store on Harwood Avenue South in Ajax. Two males, one armed with a gun, assaulted one of the store employees as they entered through a back door.



The suspects then tied up the two employees while they stole cash from the safe. The victims were able to free themselves and contacted police. The suspects fled the store and drove off in a silver vehicle. The employees suffered minor injuries.

Molotov Cocktail Thrown at Clarington Business

Investigators are asking the public to help identify a suspect who threw a Molotov cocktail at a Clarington business. On Wednesday, July 25, 2018 at approximately 4 a.m. officers were called to the Clarington News Convenience store on Hwy. 2 in Bowmanville. A male was seen throwing a Molotov cocktail, which landed in front of the store, creating a ball of flame. The fire did not result in any damage. The suspect then ran southbound and was last seen running westbound toward Green Street. The suspect is described as a male, wearing a light-coloured hooded sweatshirt.

Looking for Witnesses in Uxbridge Assault

Investigators are asking the public to help identify the person(s) responsible for an assault that sent a 16-year-old to hospital. On Tuesday, July 24, 2018 at approximately 1:20 a.m. officers were called to the Uxbridge Cottage Hospital regarding a 16-year-old male with multiple injuries. He was later taken to Sick Kids Hospital in Toronto for further tests and treatment, but has since been released. The 16-year-old male was spending the evening drinking with friends at various locations in Uxbridge, including a park, a friend's house, as well as visiting some downtown restaurants. At one point, he was assaulted by an unknown person(s) just west of the laundromat on Reach Street around 12:30 a.m. on Tuesday July 24. He woke a short time later in a pool of blood and made his way to a nearby house for assistance.
