GUNPOINT ARREST IN PORT PERRY

A Scugog man is in custody after allegedly pointing a firearm at the head of another male during a disturbance in Port Perry. On Thursday August 16, 2018, at approximately 2:20 p.m., North Division officers were called to a residence on Simcoe Street near Scugog Street in Port Perry. During an argument with another male, the suspect pulled out a handgun and pointed it at the victim's head.

In a few minutes, officers arrived and arrested the 27-year-old male at gunpoint. They located a replica handgun loaded with blank rounds. The male was handcuffed and transported to the cells in North Division, where he began hitting his head against the wall. When officers tried to move him to a safer location, he began kicking, biting and trying to head-butt officers.

He was eventually taken to Uxbridge Cottage Hospital by ambulance for treatment and a mental health assessment. He will be charged with: Pointing a Firearm; Weapons Dangerous; Assault with a Weapon; Uttering Threats; Fail to Comply with Recognizance and Fail to Comply with Probation.
