From the Council Lecturer

Who was *Monsignor Roy Figlino*?

Roy Figlino was born on May 22 1913. He entered the St. Thomas Seminary after graduating from Regis High School in 1931 and was ordained a priest on June 3, 1939. He first served as an assistant at St. John's in Denver. For 24 years, he was an administrator of the Archdiocese and then assigned as pastor at St. Augustine's Parish. It is here where he left his lasting impression upon those who were privileged to know him. He is remembered for his service, dedication and influence throughout the Brighton Catholic Community.

In 1969, he was appointed as pastor of St. Mary Magdalene Church, near Sloan's Lake by Archbishop Casey. Father Figlino was influential in turning around the finances of the parish. He successfully converted the spacious rectory, (once a Convent) into the '*Villa Madeleine*'; a home for retired priests and clergy. He served as Pastor until 1985.

By his retirement, he had received the title of Monsignor in 1986. While retired, Monsignor Figlino was far from being done and became the superior of the Villa Madeleine Retirement Home, while continuing to serve as the administrator of the St Mary Magdalene Parish.

During his priesthood, Monsignor Figlino served as the West Denver Deanery dean, Archdiocesan Consultor and Presbyter Council Member.

He died on February 14, 1995 and is buried at the Mount Olivet Catholic Cemetery.

Monsignor Figlino is an integral part of the Brighton Knights of Columbus, Council 3295 and we as its members are proud to bear his name.
