### Did you Know...

The symbols on our Altar. The original Altar was covered with a Flag, Bible and the Antlers, the symbols of the Elks love of God and country and of countrymen. The Flag was always spread so it was looking upward to the Holy Bible as the external source of the peoples right and moral duties, the Spreading Antlers of Protection symbolic of its all-embracing brotherhood. These symbols were changed in 1956. It was reported that the treatment of the American Flag was contrary to Section 176 of Title 36 U.S.Code Annotated. Change was made to add an Altar Covering and move the American Flag to the right of the Altar.

### By Law & House Rule Changes to be voted on at the Meeting:

In accordance with Grand Lodge Statutes, each Lodge is required to revise Bylaws and review house rules every 5 years. *This year we are preparing our revision and will be voting on recommended changes in the Lodge Meeting on August 17, 2023.* 

The following is a summary of the recommended changes:


#### **ByLaw Changes:**

- Dues increases have been recommended:
  - Regular and Life member Dues: \$4.00 Increase, Associate Member from \$10.00 to \$25.00. Change Tyler compensation from \$24.00 to 0.00 annually.
- Article VI; Section 8: Remove vocalist from officer list.
- Article VIII Committees; Section 4: Add an amendment to notify members that funds shall be counted and turned in immediately after events unless prior approval is given by the board of directors.
- Article XVII: Diversity Statement (Required by Grand Lodge):

#### **House Rules Changes:**

- Add to check cashing policy:
  - Collection Charges and legal actions that can be taken.
- Add Guns are not permitted on the Lodge property (previously approved).
- Add that we will Abide by State and Local Liquor Laws.
- Remove card room house rules (We no longer have a card room).
- Add Bi-annual Calendar Meeting (previously approved).
- Add *Only ADA Licensed* Service Dogs permitted in the club.
- Add Credit Card Policy (previously approved).
- Other: Word clean up to conform with Grand Lodge Statutes.

The full list of changes is available through the Secretary (Tom Chambers) and will be hanging on the bullitin board next to the bar at the Lodge.







### History of Independence Day

When the initial battles in the Revolutionary War broke out in April 1775, few colonists desired complete independence from Great Britain, and those who did were considered radical.

By the middle of the following year, however, many more colonists had come to favor independence, thanks to growing hostility against Britain and the spread of revolutionary sentiments such as those expressed in the bestselling pamphlet "Common Sense," published by Thomas Paine in early 1776.

On June 7, when the Continental Congress met at the Pennsylvania State House (later Independence Hall) in Philadelphia, the Virginia delegate Richard Henry Lee introduced a motion calling for the colonies' independence.

Amid heated debate, Congress postponed the vote on Lee's resolution, but appointed a five-man committee—including Thomas Jefferson of Virginia, John Adams of Massachusetts, Roger Sherman of Connecticut, Benjamin Franklin of Pennsylvania and Robert R. Livingston of New York—to draft a formal statement justifying the break with Great Britain.

On July 2nd, the Continental Congress voted in favor of Lee's resolution for independence in a near-unanimous vote (the New York delegation abstained, but later voted affirmatively). On that day, John Adams wrote to his wife Abigail that July 2 "will be celebrated, by succeeding Generations, as the great anniversary Festival" and that the celebration should include "Pomp and Parade...Games, Sports, Guns, Bells, Bonfires and Illuminations from one End of this Continent to the other."

On July 4th, the Continental Congress formally adopted the Declaration of Independence, which had been written largely by Jefferson. Though the vote for actual independence took place on July 2nd, from then on the 4th became the day that was celebrated as the birth of American independence.
