

The longer you have been here, the bigger the discount!! A few must know rules include: you are responsible for decorating and removal of decorations when the party is over. Cleaning is your responsibility and must be done immediately after your party. While all members are allowed to come in and use the bar during business hours, they cannot necessarily participate in or be part of your party. By Law & House Rule Changes to be voted on at the Meeting:

In accordance with Grand Lodge Statutes, each Lodge is required to revise Bylaws and review house rules every 5 years.

The bylaws and house rules proposed on the Lodge Floor passed. They will be sent in for approval and then be adopted by our Lodge.


ByLaw Changes:

- Dues increases have been recommended:
 - Regular and Life member Dues: \$4.00 Increase, Associate Member from \$10.00 to \$25.00. Change Tyler compensation from \$24.00 to 0.00 annually.
- Article VI; Section 8: Remove vocalist from officer list.
- Article VIII Committees; Section 4: Add an amendment to notify members that funds shall be counted and turned in immediately after events unless prior approval is given by the board of directors.
- Article XVII: Diversity Statement (Required by Grand Lodge):

House Rules Changes:

- Add to check cashing policy:
 - Collection Charges and legal actions that can be taken.
- Add Guns are not permitted on the Lodge property (previously approved).
- Add that we will Abide by State and Local Liquor Laws.
- Remove card room house rules (We no longer have a card room).
- Add Bi-annual Calendar Meeting (previously approved).
- Add *Only ADA Registered* Service Dogs permitted in the club.
- Add Credit Card Policy (previously approved).
- Other: Word clean up to conform with Grand Lodge Statutes.

Veterans Day

Veterans Day is a U.S. legal holiday dedicated to American veterans of all wars, and Veterans Day 2023 will occur on Saturday, November 11. In 1918, on the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month, an armistice, or temporary cessation of hostilities, was declared between the Allied nations and Germany in World War I, then known as "the Great War."

History of Armistice / Veterans Day

The Treaty of Versailles was signed on June 28, 1919, marking the official end of World War I. Nonetheless, the **armistice** date of November 11, 1918, remained in the public imagination as the date that marked the end of the conflict.

One year later, in November 1919, U.S. President Woodrow Wilson proclaimed November 11 as the first commemoration of **Armistice Day**. The day's observation included parades and public gatherings, as well as a brief pause in business and school activities at 11 a.m.

On June 4, 1926, Congress passed a resolution that the "recurring anniversary of [November 11, 1918] should be commemorated with thanksgiving and prayer and exercises designed to perpetuate peace through good will and mutual understanding between nations," and that the president should issue an annual proclamation calling for the observance of Armistice Day.

By that time, 27 state legislatures had made November 11 a legal holiday. An act approved May 13, 1938 made November 11 a legal Federal holiday, "dedicated to the cause of world peace and to be hereafter celebrated and known as 'Armistice Day.'"

In 1954, after lobbying efforts by veterans' service organizations, the 83rd U.S. Congress amended the 1938 act that had made Armistice Day a holiday, striking the word "Armistice" in favor of "Veterans." President Dwight D. Eisenhower signed the legislation on June 1, 1954. From then on, November 11 became a day to honor American veterans of all wars.

The next development in the story of Veterans Day unfolded in 1968, when Congress passed the Uniform Monday Holiday Act, which sought to ensure three-day weekends for federal employees—and encourage tourism and travel—by celebrating four national holidays (Washington's Birthday, Memorial Day, Veterans Day and Columbus Day) on Mondays.
