Ann Marlene Sundt Berg, 85, died peacefully on November 16, 2023, in Fredericksburg TX. She was born on August 24, 1938, to Anne Maude and Martin C. Sundt in Las Vegas, New Mexico.

Ann had three daughters, Mary, Linda, and Debora. Theirs was a Navy family. They moved around from Indiana to Florida to Washington State during the 1960s; settling in Annapolis, Maryland in 1971. Ann worked as a Surgical Technologist for more than 30 years and loved her career.

Most of Ann's life was spent in the Annapolis area where she enjoyed volunteering with the Girl Scouts while her girls were young.
