

#### 1st Reading: Acts 10:25-26, 34-35, 44-48

This is the message of God's great love given to all humankind, both Jew and Gentile. Peter, the simple Jewish fisherman, the man who wanted desperately to show the Lord how much he loved Him, the man who crumbled under the threat of death, stands before Cornelius the Roman Centurion and tells of God's love. All are children of God, brothers and sisters of Jesus Christ. Today, from the seat of Peter the message is identical: "In truth, I see that God shows no partiality. Rather, in every nation whoever fears him and acts uprightly is acceptable to him."

#### **2nd Reading: 1 John 4:7-10**

God loves us and we are asked only to love in return. Those who choose not to love are caught in the world's most tangled web because they can't know God. The 'good news' is that even those who have never loved are nevertheless loved by God. We, the Church, are the reflection of this love and if we take it seriously and open ourselves up to God's eternal plan, we can be that love even for those who are too lost to recognize it.

#### Gospel Reading: John 15:9-17

Jesus had but two commandments: *love God and love one another*. All sins great and small are found answered in these two; and all sins can be forgiven through the love that is Jesus Christ. This is the truth found within the gospel and the freedom that follows is as pure and filled with hope as childlike faith can find. If we live by loving rather than mistrusting others, life becomes simple and Jesus truly becomes more present to the world. And does this message come as from a King to a subject? Does it come from the powerful to the powerless? Does it come from the wise to the foolish? No, it comes from one friend to his friends, and that friend reaches out and names us in the beginning to be his friends. Who could possibly ask more?

#### Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor

It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement.

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-HourChild Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis. To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.
