Greetings!

In 2018 residents showed widespread support for the township's Parks and Trails Master Plan. We've officially taken the first steps to putting levies on the November ballot which will provide the funds needed to buy land and begin building parks and trails - making the Plan a reality.



The proposed levies total 1.5 mills, amounting to \$52.50 a year or 14 cents a day per \$100,000 of home valuation as shown on the County Auditor's website.

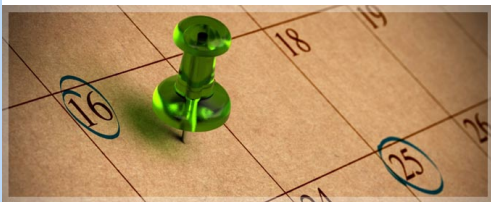
More details are coming soon, so stay tuned, but we're excited that this November our residents will have the opportunity to vote on the future of Berkshire Township.

Senior Appliance Pickup Service Now Available



DELAWARE, Oh. – The Senior Appliance Pickup service is again available to older adults looking to rid themselves of any electronics and appliances.

This year marks the 16th year for this Delaware General Health District Keep Delaware County Beautiful program, which is funded by SourcePoint. **The service is free and available to all Delaware County adults age 55 and older.**

Accurate IT will be picking up items for recycling. The company is R2 certified, meaning e-waste is handled in an environmentally-responsible

manner.

Residents are limited to one television per household. Multiples of other electronics and appliances will be accepted. Program will continue until funds are depleted, so call soon if you are interested.

Traffic News - Good and Not as Good

The good news is the long-awaited traffic light at SR 3 and South Galena Road was scheduled to be up and operating by the end of June. As of this writing it was not complete but progress has been made. This will close the chapter on a lengthy improvement project at that intersection.

On the not as convenient side, two roads affecting our residents will have lengthy closures.

- Cheshire Road is closed between Berlin Manor Dr. on the east to Gregory Rd. on the west, as they are building a roundabout at Cheshire and Piatt Rds. It is scheduled to be closed until sometime in August. This affects those who use Cheshire Rd. going west to SourcePoint, Rt. 23, Ohio Health on Ohio Health Blvd. etc.
- Walnut Street, going into the Village of Galena is scheduled to be closed June 24 through August 26 for emergency repairs. The closure runs from High St. to Church street in Galena.

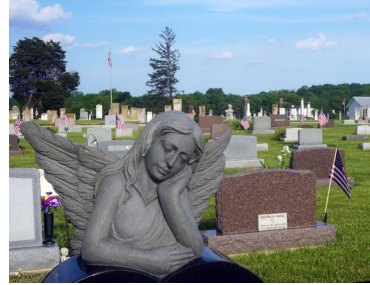
Berkshire Cemetery

Last month we told you about the amount of work needed to maintain a beautiful cemetery. This month we address a related issue.

We're having problem with decorations on grave sites in the cemetery. Please take note of the requirements below. If there are items in violation, our staff may remove them for

the safety of staff and visitors.

The biggest concern is items that are not allowed (metal stakes, any glass containers, decorative stone, etc.) and also decor that extends more than 12 inches from the face of the headstones. No decor is permitted to the sides or the rear of a headstone. This is for the safety of workers as well as visitors when mowing or weed-eating is done. These types of objects can become projectiles and injure someone.



Individual Grave Site Decor - Please read

- **Glass containers or metal stakes, gravel or stone, fences, etc. are prohibited and will be removed.**
- The planting of any tree, shrub, rose bush or similar plant is prohibited.
- **Any decoration or flower planting must be placed within twelve inches (12") of the face of the grave marker and may not extend past the sides or behind the marker.**
- Maintaining flowers planted or decorations within the twelve-inch area is the responsibility of the lot owner or family.
- Artificial flowers will be removed by maintenance twice a year, April 1st and Nov. 1st, or if they become damaged, unsightly, or a danger to mowing and trimming.
- Berkshire Township will use reasonable care in maintenance of the cemetery and grave sites. However, considering the vulnerability of the grave, lot markers, memorials as well as floral tributes, Berkshire Township disclaims any responsibility or liability for accidents or damage to such items resulting from the ordinary hazards of maintenance work.

Thursday is the service day for the township. Trash will be picked up weekly and recycling will be picked up every other week, with the exception of scheduled holidays when any pick-ups will be Friday. **THE MAILER YOU RECEIVED FROM RUMPKE HAS YOUR RECYCLING and HOLIDAY CALENDAR ON IT, or you can contact Rumpke at the email above with questions.**

A friendly reminder on trash cart placement. The wheels on the trash cart should be towards your house, with the small silver-colored handle on the front of the cart and the lid opening facing the street. This allows the drivers to collect the carts in a more automated, time-saving, safe way.

We encourage you to always collect your empty trash cans after pick-up as high winds may cause them to blow into the road, creating a traffic hazard. (It keeps our streets and neighborhoods looking nicer, too.)

For residents not familiar with the decision, the choice to contract with one hauler was made for several reasons, but the two main ones were: 1) Economics (it saved the majority of residents quite a bit on their monthly bill and provided recycling) and 2) Safety/Maintenance (it greatly reduced the number of heavy trucks on our roads daily, making it safer for our kids and reducing wear and tear on our roads.)
