MOAA CHAPTER PRESIDENT'S NOTES JANUARY

#### 2024 Will be a Good Year for the CVC Chapter

We start this year with three goals: Legislative Advocacy on issues that affect service members, retirees, and family members; Membership because that gives us greater Legislative influence; and Community



Service because it allows us to help those in need where we can assist with our limited resources. Thank you Tony for the invocation, and Melba for the Inspirational story.

We held our January meeting on the 23<sup>rd</sup> after having our original date rained out. Our Speaker Attorney Frank Lumpkin IV was able to participate on our rescheduled date. Going through his last year of High School, then through University of Georgia, then Law School, he became interested what was proposed and is now partially in place, Interstate I-14 "Forts to Ports". It starts in Texas as a branch off of I-20, and connects with Fort Cavazos (formerly Ft Hood), and is being put in place with upgrades to segments that are near interstate standards and is running to Louisiana. The route through Louisiana will run close to Fort Johnson (formerly Ft Polk). It then runs through Mississippi and then through Alabama. The route through Alabama will connect with I-65 close to Selma, use I-65 to Montgomery then use I-85 to Tuskegee, and then use US 80 to near Phenix City, with some rerouting. It would connect with the JR Allen Parkway, with some engineering near Midland to route in a manner that does not impact Pratt & Whitney, but connects with US 80, following that path to Macon, where it can tie into US I-16 to Savannah, and part of it continuing to Augusta where it can tie into I-20. The Interstate Concept has Federal Highway Administration approval, with years of details to be worked out. It has had at least two Georgia Governors approve the concept, and Columbus Council approved the concept.

Why it is important? It connects 9 military bases with East Coast Ports, which was a reason for the Interstate System, avoiding Atlanta gridlock. This can facilitate the movement of a lot of five divisions of equipment if needed in the event of a crisis. Under full mobilization is supports the movement of forces generated at Fort Moore direct access to the GA/FL ports, along with Fort Cavazos and Fort Johnson, along with USAF bases along the route. It also offers a significant economic development opportunity to Selma and Tuskegee, and both receive direct benefit. Frank Lumpkin explained all of this and did a wonderful job. We offer him our full support, and we hope to have him back for updates. He will be a Army SJA through the Reserves and will do much of his work at Fort Moore so we hope to see more of him.

#### VA HEALTHCARE ISSUE – BEING RESEARCHED FOR LEGISLATIVE ADVOCACY

There is an action ongoing to provide VA CCR access to Illegal Aliens. The VA was created to provide care for the Veterans who have served our Nation, and it is designed to address their training and war related health issues, to honor their service. To divert VA facilities and staff is the first step in the destruction of the Veterans Administration and moving it toward public health. The VA is understaffed in many locations and specialties and wait times can already be excessive for Veterans.

With a Veteran the VA has military health records, immunizations, regional deployment and exposure histories, exposure to disease prone areas, and they know how to treat us. With an illegal immigrant who is not authorized under law, the VA has no files, no medical histories, and they become exposed to whatever the illegal immigrant has and veterans are in turn exposed so it increases threat of exposure to veterans and their health.

DHS says they will reimburse the VA, but that does not cover Veterans and additional delays who by virtue of health and age are adversely impacted.

Watch for more to follow as we prepare a DRAFT letter for Legislators. We are going to recommend we oppose the diversion of Veterans Administration Healthcare to anyone except Veterans.
