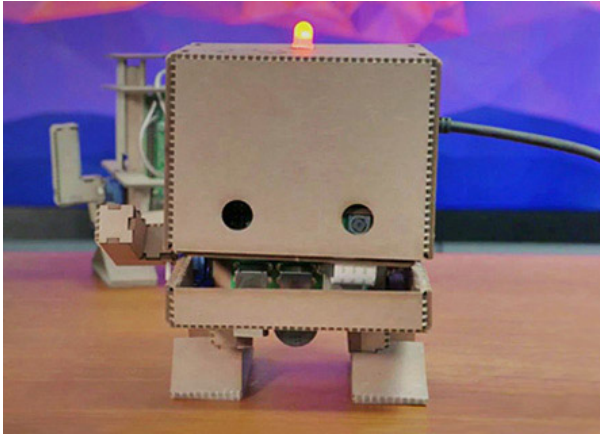

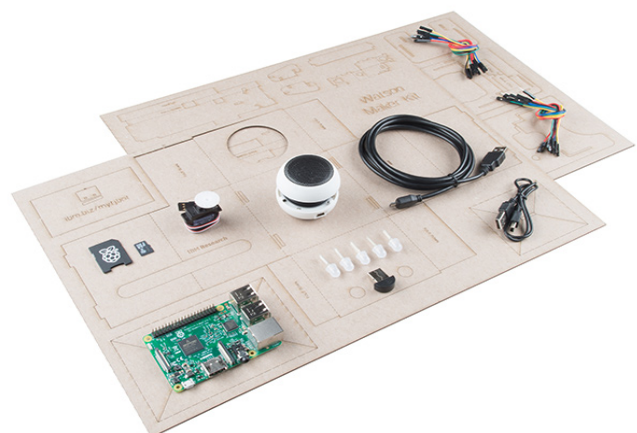
Assemble your TJBot

- Raspberry Pi Model 3
- 16GB NOOBS Card
- USB Microphone
- Speaker
- Servo
- LEDs
- Wires

To make TJBot you will need a 3D printed or laser cut robot body, a Raspberry Pi and a variety of add-ons to get started, including: a RGB LED light, a microphone, speaker, servo motor, wires, USB cable, and a camera. Make your own TJBot with your own parts or order a kit.

John Bergren was a member of the CEO's staff in Armonk, following which he was the director of the Santa Teresa/Silicon Valley lab. He had served in the U S Marine Corps.

Vic Butera was a mechanical designer in the lab. Two of his projects were the single disk Aries file and the ink jet printer program. In retirement he lived in San Miguel where he had a vineyard.

John Clarke was a programmer in IBM Global Services. He was in building 26 information technology support. He lived in San Juan Beautista.

Kathy Gonsalves was a nurse by profession. She retired from IBM in 2001 as a managing nurse after 31 years with the company.

Joe Preston joined IBM in Poughkeepsie in 1961. He became a customer engineer, primarily in the Los Angeles area. In 1969 he came to the San Jose area, working on the Advanced Computer System in Menlo Park. At the San Jose plant he remained in Field Engineering where he worked on APAR responses and other service planning tasks. After retirement he was a member of the 1401 restoration team at the Computer History Museum.

Frank Rutkowitz worked in manufacturing methods engineering, industrial engineering and cost engineering. In retirement he was living in Fernly, NV. Frank had served in the U S Navy.

Dick Sillan was a facilities manager in East Fishkill and San Jose. He served as a 2nd lieutenant in the U S Army during the Korean War.

Dennis Tigges worked in the development lab for 42 years. His assignments included recording channel and servo integration.

Wayne Walter was a systems engineer beginning in Houston and for many years in the Bay Area. At the plant site he worked in disk information technology. He served in the Merchant Marine in World War II and also later served in the U S Navy.

MAGNIFICENT CITIES OF CENTRAL & EASTERN EUROPE
Berlin, Vienna, Prague, Budapest, Krakow and Warsaw
September 23 – October 6, 2018

Highlights....Berlin wall, Prague Old town and St. Charles bridge, Sochretorte Cafe, Schoenbrunn Castle,

Your journey starts in Germany's capital city of Berlin. This city dates back to the 13th century. We will visit the site of Check Point Charlie and what the remains of the Berlin wall. Next we travel through Dresden on our way to the historical city of Prague in the Czech Republic. During our stay, we will visit a number of sites including Hradcany Castle, the statue lined St. Charles Bridge and do a



walking tour through the Old Town and see the Astronomical clock. One evening we will take in a colorful Folklore show. Our next city is the vibrant city of Vienna, the 'Musical City'.

Mozart, Beethoven and Sigmund Freud called Vienna their home. We will visit the lavish Schoenbrunn Castle, the summer retreat of the Habsburg Dynasty. On your leisure time visit the beautiful Sochretorte café and try some Viennese coffee. Our next journey takes us to the lovely city of Budapest, Hungary's capitol, located on the lovely Danube River. On the way we travel through the picturesque Hungarian country side. Our tour now takes us to Poland to

the grand city of Krakow. On the way we make a stop in the hidden village of Donovaly, nestled in the low Tatras mountain range of Slovakia. A must visit is the beautiful Krakow market square. We will visit Wawel Castle, a former residence of the Polish Kings. We now travel through the Polish countryside on our way to Warsaw, with its Gothic church's and beautiful buildings that were reconstructed after the war. We will do a tour of Historical Warsaw, then take some leisure time to walk this unique, colorful city.

The cost of this 14 **day tour**, including AIR, is only 4,399.00, double occupancy. This Includes round trip air from SFO, hotels, included excursions, transfers, and motor coach transportation from San Jose to SFO and back. Also included are 18 meals: 12 Breakfast & 6 dinners. The tour date is September 23 – October 6, 2018. The trip brochure is available upon request, hard copy or via e mail. Brochures will also be available at the Information Session.
