### **Crazy Hope Community Center - Update**

Have you ever walked through a season of life when it did not appear much was happening only to find out God was doing a mighty work behind the scenes? Sometimes life is like that, and sometimes that is what happens with the Crazy Hope Community Center. You may drive by the center and, by its outward appearance, it may seem like not much is going on. But rest assured, a lot is happening behind the scenes!



Since our last newsletter, we have held two clean-up days at Crazy Hope, and volunteers have given up their time on Saturday to remove walls, unsightly nails, and other debris from the inside of the building. We have also moved into what we hope is the last planning phase with our engineer and architect as they work together for our final design documents so that we will have the most up-to-date architectural drawings and design specifications we need to hire contractors as we move forward with our renovations.

Although we are waiting for our final drawings, we have been given approval by our engineer to begin replacing the facilities' exterior doors. This will be a much needed improvement to our facility as it will make the building more secure and certainly improve its visual appeal. It is with great anticipation that we expect this work to begin any day because the Executive Board has already received quotes for this work and selected a contractor. At the time of this publication, the materials have been ordered, work has started (as seen in our new cover photo), and the door framing and installation should begin any day. Be sure to keep an eye out for our new doors!


As we move into Spring and better weather, it is our prayer that we will continue making progress with Phase 2 renovations.
